STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SIXTEEN.

AN ACT TO REPEAL THE ACTS CONSOLIDATED IN THE REVISED STATUTES OF THE YEAR ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SIXTEEN.

Be it Enacted by the People of the State of Maine:

Sec. 1. The public acts, passed during the years hereinafter named and herein designated, are repealed, except so far as they are preserved or excepted in the following sections; but no other acts are hereby repealed.

1903.

Chapter numbered two hundred three of the public laws of the year nineteen hundred three, entitled "An act to provide for the preservation of town records of births, marriages and deaths previous to the year eighteen hundred ninety-two."

All the chapters of the revised statutes of the year nineteen hundred and three, numbered one to one hundred and forty-five, inclusive, except Chapter 72, entitled "The Insolvent Law."

1905.

Chapters numbered one to one hundred and seventy-eight, inclusive, except

Chapter 172, Section one, relating to corporations.

Chapter 175, entitled "An act authorizing the acceptance of the conveyance of the Kennebec Arsenal property by the State of Maine," and

Chapter 176, entitled "An act giving the trustees of insane hospitals authority to control and occupy Widow's Island."

1907.

Chapters numbered one to one hundred and eighty-nine, inclusive, except Chapter 39, entitled "An act to assent to the purpose and provisions of an act of the Congress of the United States, entitled 'An act to provide for an increased annual appropriation for agricultural experiment stations and regulating the expenditure thereof,'" and

Chapter 109, Section one, relating to corporations.

1909.

Chapters numbered one to two hundred and sixty-five, inclusive, except Chapter 127, Section one, relating to corporations.

1911.

Chapters numbered one to one hundred and ninety-nine, inclusive, except Chapter 182, Section one, relating to corporations.

1912.

Chapter numbered one of the laws enacted at the special session of the legislature convened in the year one thousand nine hundred and twelve.

1913.

Chapters numbered one to two hundred and twenty-one, inclusive, except Chapter 186, Section one, relating to corporations.

1915.

Chapters numbered one to three hundred and fifty-one, inclusive, except Chapter 168, entitled "An act confirming the official acts of Frank D. Fenderson, acting as register of deeds for York county,"

Chapter 182, entitled "An act directing the Treasurer of State to correct the state treasury records for the years nineteen hundred eight and nineteen hundred nine, relating to the payment of State, County and Forestry District taxes on one Forty-eighth Part of Township Number Two, Range Nine, West from the East Line of the State, in Piscataquis County,"

Sections fourteen to twenty, both inclusive, of Chapter 206, entitled "An act to establish a State Reformatory for Women,"

Chapter 236, entitled "An act to enable the cities and towns of the State of Maine to appropriate money to aid in the erection of the Knox Memorial Building,"

Chapter 253, entitled "An act to amend section thirteen of chapter two hundred four of the Public Laws of Eighteen Hundred Fifty-six, relating to the Recorder of the Municipal Court for the city of Portland,"

Chapter 254, entitled "An act to amend section two of Chapter two hundred four of the Public Laws of Eighteen Hundred Fifty-six in relation to the jurisdiction of the Municipal Court of the city of Portland as amended by section one of Chapter twenty-eight of the Public Laws of Eighteen Hundred Eighty-seven, and section one of Chapter one hundred thirty-four of the Public Laws of Eighteen Hundred Ninety-five,"

Sections one and three of chapter 314, entitled "An act authorizing the Secretary of State to prepare lists of corporations delinquent in payment of their franchise taxes,"

Chapter 319, entitled "An act to provide for State and County aid in the construction of Highway Bridges,"

Chapter 341, entitled "An act for the better protection and preservation of the Lobster Fisheries, authorizing the appointment of a commission,"

Chapter 343, entitled "An act to provide for the Destruction of Dog Fish and other members of the Shark species,"

Chapter 350, entitled "An act relative to the Hours of Employment of Women and Minors,"

Also the following chapters relating to Inland Fish and Game, viz; chapters four, five, six, seven, eight, eleven, twelve, thirteen, fourteen, sixteen, eighteen, nineteen, twenty, twenty-three, fifty-two, fifty-three, fifty-four, sixty-four, sixty-seven, seventy-six, seventy-seven, eighty-five, eighty-seven, eighty-eight, ninety-three, one hundred twenty-eight, one hundred thirty-one, one hundred thirty-two, one hundred thirty-four, one hundred thirty-five, one hundred fifty-five, one hundred fifty-six, one hundred fifty-seven, one hundred fifty-eight, one hundred sixty, one hundred sixty-one, one hundred sixty-two, one hundred sixty-three, one hundred seventy-one, one hundred eighty-five, one hundred eighty-six, one hundred eighty-seven, one hundred eighty-eight, one hundred eighty-nine, one hundred ninety, one hundred ninety-one, one hundred ninety-two, two hundred eight, two hundred nine, two hundred ten, two hundred eleven, two hundred twelve, two hundred thirteen, two hundred fourteen, two hundred fifteen, two hundred sixteen, two hundred twenty-five, two hundred twenty-six, two hundred twenty-seven, two hundred twenty-eight, two hundred twenty-nine, two hundred forty-five, two hundred forty-six, two hundred seventy-nine, two hundred ninety, three hundred one, three hundred two.

Sec. 2. The private and special acts passed during the years hereinafter named and herein designated, are repealed; but no other such acts are repealed.

1903.

Chapter six, entitled "An act authorizing the State Treasurer to purchase unmatured State of Maine bonds."

1907.

Chapter two hundred and eight, entitled "An act authorizing the agent of the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians to remove any of the distressed poor of that tribe to either reservation within his agency limits."

Chapter three hundred and sixty-six, entitled "An act in relation to compensation for clerk hire in the office of the clerk of courts for the County of Androscoggin."

Chapter four hundred and twenty-five, entitled "An act to provide for a clerk for the register of deeds for the northern registry of deeds for Aroostook County," and

Chapter four hundred and twenty-eight, entitled "An act relating to the office of register of probate of Androscoggin County."

1911.

Chapter fifty-seven, entitled "An act to improve certain state lands."

Sec. 3. The repeal of the acts aforesaid does not revive any of the acts repealed by them. Acts of incorporation declared to be public acts are not repealed. The acts declared to be repealed remain in force for the trial and punishment of all past violations of them; and for the recovery of penalties

or forfeitures already incurred; and for the preservation of all rights and their remedies existing by virtue of them; and so far as they apply to any office, trust, judicial proceeding, right, contract, limitation, or event, already affected by them.

Sec. 4. This act shall take effect on the first day of January, nineteen hundred and seventeen.
