CHAPTER 311

SHOES AND LEATHER GOODS

1751. Exclusive right of manufacturer to stamp.

§ 1751. Exclusive right of manufacturer to stamp

Every manufacturer of leather and of boots and shoes, of any description, has the exclusive right of stamping them with the initials of his Christian name and the whole of his surname. Such stamping is a warranty that the article is merchantable and well made of good materials. If any person fraudulently stamps any such articles with the name or stamp of any other person, he shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$20 or by imprisonment for not more than 6 months.
