CHAPTER 1
GENERAL PROVISIONS

 2. Acts of incorporation altered or repealed.

§ 1. Application

Chapters 1 to 21 apply to all corporations organized by special acts of the Legislature or under the general laws of the State, except so far as they are inconsistent with such special acts or with public statutes concerning particular classes of corporations.

§ 2. Acts of incorporation altered or repealed

Acts of incorporation passed since March 17, 1831 may be amended, altered or repealed by the Legislature, as if express provision therefor were made in them unless they contain an express limitation. This section shall not deprive the courts of any power which they have at common law over a corporation or its officers.
