To the President of the Senate.

SIR :

IN obedience to an Order of the Senate passed on the 31st of January last, directing the Secretary of State "to lay before the Legislature a statement of all the expenses which have been incurred by the State, on account of the State Prison, including the expenses of the site, the erection of buildings, the salaries and compensation of all officers and other persons employed in conducting and managing its operations, the removal and support of all the convicts, together with all other expenditures which have arisen to the State, from forming, executing, conducting, and carrying on the State Prison system ; and also the whole amount of receipts which

have accrued to the State from the operation of that system, including all sums arising from the labor of convicts, from donations by visitants, and all other sources of revenue or income, connected with said Prison or the system of conducting its affairs.” I have the honor to submit the following; in which the several particulars called for are given, as far as they can be ascertained from documents in my possession.

The exact amount which has been expended for the “salaries and compensation of all officers and other persons employed in conducting and managing the affairs of the Prison,” not being stated in the Reports of the Wardens, I am unable to furnish the several items as contemplated in the order.

* By the Resolve under which this Committee was appointed, it was also made their duty “ to visit such towns as they may deem proper, and designate some central and suitable place at which the seat of Government may be permanently fixed and established; to ascertain the terms upon which a convenient lot for the accommodation of the State can be obtained, and the time when it will be proper for the Legislature to meet at the place thus designated;” and for this service was a part of the sum paid.

A Committee, consisting of John Ruggles and Erastus Foote, was, under a Resolve of the Legislature passed February 9, 1828, appointed to consider the statutes respecting the State Prison, all laws concerning crimes and punishments, &c., and to report the result of their examination to the next Legislature. The account presented by this Committee for their services, has not yet been settled.
