The Joint Standing Committee on the State Prison to whom was referred the accounts of Joel Miller, Warden of said Prison, have had the same under consideration, and

REPORT:

That by schedules presented to the Committee, there was due to the State on demands in possession of the Warden, Oct. 31, 1834, viz:

Leaving a balance of demands and cash in the hands of the Warden of \$13,274 82. Of this sum \$1,231 90 is reported by the Warden to have been received in cash, and \$2,256 16 reported as due from the Warden, on settlement of his account by the Inspectors.

Your Committee further Report, that the stock on hand at the Prison, belonging to the State, is as follows, as by Report made Oct. 31, 1835.

A large proportion of the notes and accounts is believed by your Committee to be collectable.

By a Resolve of 1835, the Warden was directed to collect the debts due the Prison. Little attention appears to have been paid to this Resolve. The practice of giving credits at the Prison for articles sold, appears not to be authorized by law, and is believed by your Committee to be injurious to the best interests of the Institution.

Your Committee further recommend that such measures be taken as will cause a speedy and effectual settlement of the accounts with the Warden in full, also that an account of all the stock of every kind be taken at the time the present Warden leaves the Prison.

Your Committee further recommend that in no case shall a less sum than twenty-five dollars be charged to any person or persons as credit.
