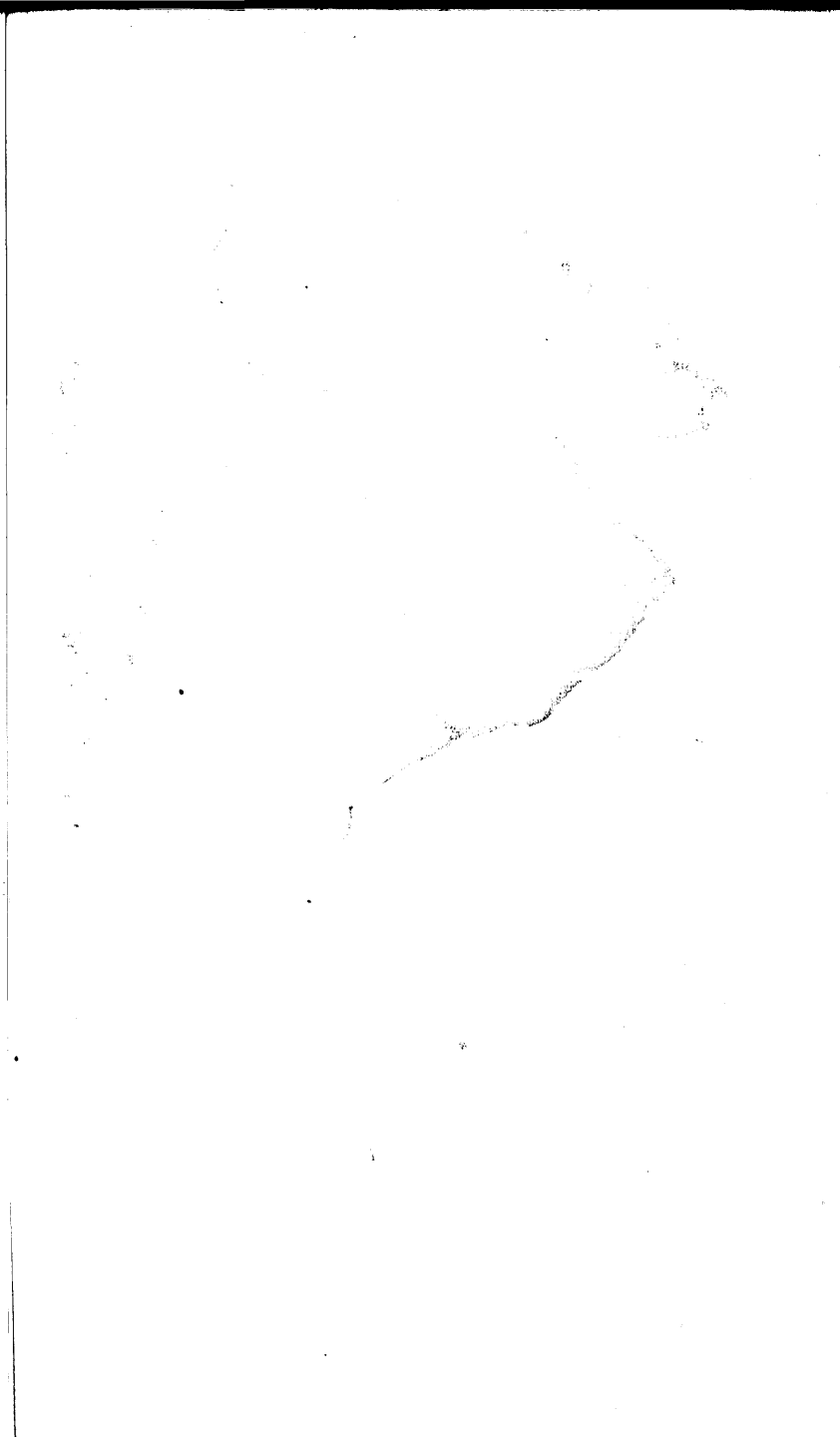
AN ACT making appropriation for the support
of the Government.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate
2 and House of Representatives in Legislature
3 assembled, That the amount of money to be
4 received into the Treasury of this State from
5 the several Banks, who are required to pay a
6 tax, be and the same is hereby appropriated,
7 for the payment of the expenses of the Gov-
8 ernment.*

SECT. 2. *Be it enacted, That in addition
2 to the tax on Banks, there shall be, and hereby
3 is appropriated for the expenses of the Govern-
4 ment, the further sum of One Hundred Thou-
5 sand Dollars ; and the Treasurer is hereby*

6 authorized and required to apply said sum for
7 the purposes aforesaid, out of the first instal-
8 ment to be received by this State, under the
9 Act of the Congress of the United States enti-
10 tled "An Act to regulate the Deposits of the
11 Public Money," passed June 23d, 1836.

SECT. 3. *Be it enacted*, That all acts and
2 parts of acts inconsistent with this act, be and
3 the same is hereby repealed.
