#### STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED

AND THIRTY-EIGHT.

AN ACT additional to "An Act respecting Mortgages and the Rights in Equity of Redemption.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the Senate 2 and House of Representatives, in Legislature 3 assembled, That, in all cases of Mortgages of 4 real estate, in addition to the modes now pro-5 vided by law for foreclosing the same, the mort-6 gagee or his assigns may give public notice, in 7 some newspaper printed in the county, where 8 said real estate is situated, of his claim by mort-9 gage to such real estate, and that the condition 10 in the same has been broken, by reason whereof

11 he claims to foreclose such mortgage, which
12 notice shall be published three weeks successively
13 in such newspaper; or such mortgagee or his
14 assigns may cause a notice of such claim to
15 foreclose to be served on the mortgagor or his
16 assigns, by having an attested copy of such notice
17 delivered to him in hand by the Sheriff or his
18 Deputy, or any Constable of the town, where
19 the mortgagor or his assigns may live; and said
20 publication, or notice and service thereof, shall
21 be considered as equivalent to, and as having all
22 the effects of, an open and peaceable entry for
23 the purpose of foreclosing.

SECT. 2. Be it further enacted, That a 2 copy of such public notice, and the name and 3 date of the newspaper, in which the last publi-4 cation is had, or the original notice and the 5 officer's return thereon, shall be recorded in the 6 Registry of Deeds, where the mortgage is 7 recorded, within thirty days after the last pub-8 lication of the notice, or the service of said 9 notice, on the mortgagor or his assigns; and, 10 if not so recorded, the same shall be of no 11 avail for the purpose of foreclosing.
