#### REMARKS.

There were 351 cities, towns and plantations, which were required, by "An Additional Act to provide for the Education of Youth," passed February 13, 1837, to make returns of their Schools, for the year preceding, to the Office of the Secretary of State, on or before the 20th day of January last.

Blank forms embracing, under appropriate heads, all the topics upon which statistical information was required by this law, had been furnished to the Selectmen of towns and to the Assessors of plantations, and it was undoubtedly expected by the Legislature, that an Abstract from the returns made would show, pretty accurately, the practical operation of our Common School System of Education.

This expectation, however, must be measurably disappointed; for, of the 351 cities, towns and plantations in the State, but 160 made returns under all the heads in the blank forms furnished;—312 returned the number of School districts;—316 the number of children between the ages of 4 and 21 years;—279 the number who usually attend School:—205 the amount of money raised and expended for the support of Schools, designating how it had accrued, and 209 the time the Schools had been kept by Master and Mistress.

Beside these omissions, under some of the heads the returns, in many instances, are very difficult to be understood, and, although much pains have been taken to ascertain the meaning, success has not in all cases been certain.

It will be perceived by the Abstract, that the "total" amount of money raised and expended for the support of Schools will not, in any of the Counties, and in many of the towns, agree with the sum of the items, of which it appears to be composed. The difference arises principally from the fact, that in adding the items, the bank tax would be embraced twice, unless regard

should be paid to the note with this mark (\*) at the foot of each county, and partly from errors in the returns under the head "total," occasioned by dividing the money among the several School districts.

In all cases where the amount of bank tax could be ascertained from the return, it is given as returned; where no mention is made of it, recourse has been had to the State Treasurer's Books for the amount of Bank tax distributed, and where his Books show a difference from the sum returned of more than \$1, it is stated in the notes.

From the School Returns, incomplete and imperfect as they were found to be, it is not practicable to make the comparisons and deductions, required by the Resolves, with the desirable correctness. Such as have been made, will be found in the following Recapitulation and Table of Comparative Views.
