STATE OF MAINE.

Resolve for the publication and distribution of an Abstract of the Returns of
Common Schools.

RESOLVED, That the Secretary of State be directed to cause an Abstract in tabular form, by Counties, to be made annually, of the Returns of Common Schools, made by the several cities, towns and plantations within this State, together with a statement of the population of each city, town and plantation, according to the last preceding census; and such comparisons of said returns, and of the population, and such deductions therefrom as may be usefully and conveniently made; and a statement of the dividend from the annual School Fund or Bank Tax, as shown by the returns of that year, also showing what School Books are used, so far as the same can be done from the returns.

RESOLVED, That it shall be the duty of the Secretary of State to cause a sufficient number of copies of the abstract and statements aforesaid to be printed, and to forward by mail, or otherwise, to the Aldermen of the several cities, Selectmen of the several towns, and Assessors of the several plantations one copy for each School District within such city, town or plantation. And such Aldermen, Selectmen and Assessors are hereby required, as soon as may be, on the receipt of such Abstracts, to distribute one copy thereof to each School District within such city, town or plantation.

NOTE. The following towns returned the number of scholars "who usually attend school," without designating the number that attend a Master's or Mistress's school; and are as follows, viz: Eliot 739, South Berwick 695.

From the town of Kennebunk-port, no return was received until subsequent to the time required by law.

No return has been received from the town of Lebanon. The number of School Districts, number of Scholars, and the total amount raised and expended, are taken from the return of last year.

a. The Fund accrued "from sale of lands reserved for the towns,"

and is "not apportioned" this year. Of the Private Schools, &c., one is a High School; kept eight weeks; 25 scholars; tuition 25 cents.

b. There is one Academy which has been in constant operation for the last several years, with the exception of the last year, of which time it has been in operation 15 weeks; average number of scholars 40; tuition, for those in town, \$3 50; for those out of town, \$3 00 per quarter.

c. Nothing is returned under the head of "Academies or Private Schools," but it appears by a note in the return that \$150 is paid for Private Schools.

d. The amount under the head of "subscription," is stated in a note at the bottom of the return, and not in its proper place.

e. The return states "one Academy and one Private School, kept during the year;" not stating the number of weeks.

f. Of the money expended, \$18 40 was paid to the "committee and for contingencies."

g. The Bank Tax due this town was \$159 79; but through mistake in the apportionment, but \$57 30 was received.

h. Funds, "from sale of lands, reserved in the original grant of the town for schooling, said lands have been sold and proceeds loaned on mortgage of real estate, amounting to \$1,376."

i. Funds, "from interest on Surplus Revenue;" "There is one Academy and three Private Schools in this town, all kept through the year."

j. Funds, "interest of School Fund from sale of lands reserved for said town."

NOTE. The following towns returned the number of scholars "who usually attend school," without designating the number that attend a school kept by a "Master" or "Mistress," and are as follows, viz.—Cape Elizabeth, 612; Falmouth, 629; Harrison, 397; Minot, 1,154; Portland, 5,653; Sebago, 205.

From the towns of Danville, Freeport, Gray, Harpswell, Raymond and Standish, no return was received until subsequent to the time required by law.

a. In more than half of the Districts in this town, no return is made of the number of scholars "who usually attend school," or the "number of weeks the school has been kept," so that the Abstract probably shows incorrect information under those heads.

b. The *Fund* accrued "by grant of land from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, which has been sold." In four Districts "no charge was made for board."

c. Three Districts are connected with Districts out of town—so that the Abstract does not show the full amount of schooling. "Some Districts give wood and board."

d. One District classed with District out of town.

e. The Fund of \$50, under the head of "Subscription," "contributed for board."

f. "There is an Academy and Teachers' Seminary—Male and Female Departments; with 80 Male and 100 Female Pupils."

g. *Fund*, "by sale of School Lands."

h. It appears by a note in the return from this town, that there are two Islands containing 13 scholars, which are not included in the Abstract; in both, 22 weeks schooling.

i. Of the *Fund*, \$44 accrued "from a grant of land from Massachusetts," and \$99 41 from "interest on Surplus Revenue."

j. "Board given"—"Wood generally given." *Fund*, "interest from Surplus Revenue."

k. "In 1837, the income of our School Fund was \$232 50, but the present year it is nothing, being all invested in Bank Stock"—accrued "from sale of lands." "Private Schools are common for small children in the large Districts." Tuition *6d.* and *9d.* per week.

l. *Fund*, "from sale of land."

m. The "number who usually attend school"—"by Master, from 20 to 70; by Mistress, from 12 to 50, in each District." "Number of weeks the school has been kept in each—by Master, from 6 to 16; by Mistress, from 4 to 17."

n. The return does not state the number of weeks the schools have kept, but under the head of "No. of weeks the school has been kept," is the following note, (by Master,) "4 schools through the year; 2 on Islands in winter, seven months in both." (By Mistress,) "9 schools through the year; 2 on Islands in summer, in both."

"The City is not divided into Districts, the whole being only one District—13 schools in the City proper, and 2 on Islands."

The Bank Tax is taken from the books in the Treasury Department, none having been returned, and is presumed to be included in the \$7,000, under the head of "Town Tax."

o. *Funds*, "from sale of School Lands."

p. *Fund*, "the interest of \$2,000, the donation of P. Thatcher, Esq., and is for the benefit of Districts No. 9, 10 and 11."

R E M A R K S .

IN preparing the foregoing Abstract, great pains have been taken to embody all useful information that could be obtained from the returns made. Although the returns are more perfect, and fewer towns have neglected to make returns than last year, there is much room for improvement. For several towns have neglected to make returns at all, and many that have made them, have omitted much important information that was required.

Where towns have neglected to make returns, recourse has been had to the returns of last year for such information as was deemed most important, which, though it may vary a fraction from the true amounts, will, nevertheless, it is believed, give a more perfect view in the abstract, than a ratio from the towns returned.

The Catalogue of Books, at the bottom of each County, comprises all that are named in any of the returns. Some towns returned nearly all that are mentioned—others but a small part—others none.

The sources from which the amount under the head of “all other funds,” have accrued, may be found by a reference at the bottom of each County; and also the remarks accompanying each return that was thought of any importance.

The “comparisons” and “deductions” required by the Resolve, so far as were found practicable, and deemed to be useful, from the facts communicated by the returns, have been made, which may be found in the following TABLE.
