STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND THIRTY-NINE.

AN ACT additional to an Act entitled "An Act against Hawkers, Pedlars and Petty Chapman," approved February 10, 1821.

[SECTION 1.] Be it enacted by the Senate 2 and House of Representatives in Legislature 3 assembled, That any person who is a citizen 4 of this State and who will procure a certificate 5 from the Selectmen of the town where he re-6 sides, that he is of good moral character, may 7 apply to the County Commissioners of any 8 County in this State, for a license to sell all or 9 any of the articles prohibited by the first section 10 of the act, to which this is additional, and like-11 wise, the article of Tin Ware, for one year from 12 the time of said application, and said Commis-13 sioners shall grant said license : Provided, the

14 applicant therefor, shall produce to said Com15 missioners said certificate, and also a receipt
16 from the Treasurer of said County that he has
17 deposited *five dollars* for the use of the State,
18 on condition said license is granted, and the
19 person obtaining such license shall be permitted
20 *personally* to vend any or all of the articles pro21 hibited in the first section of an act, to which
22 this is additional approved February 10, 1821.
SEC. 2. Be it further enacted, 'That nothing

2 in this act, or the act to which this is addi3 tional, shall be so construed as to make any far4 mer, market man or other person, liable to the
5 penalties of the acts aforesaid, who does not
6 make pedling his regular occupation.

SEC. 3. Be it further enacted, That all 2 acts and parts of acts inconsistent with the fore-3 going, be and the same is hereby repealed.
