THE CONSTITUTION.

STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE to amend the Constitution, relative to the time of holding the annual State elections, and the sitting of the Legislature.

Resolved, by the Senate and House of Rep-2 resentatives in Legislature assembled, That 3 the first section of the third part of the fourth 4 article of the Constitution, which provides, that 5 the Legislature shall convene on the first Wed-6 nesday of January annually, shall be so altered 7 and amended, that the future sessions of the 8 Legislature shall be held on the first Wednes-9 day of September annually, from and after the 10 first Wednesday of September, in the year of 11 our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty 12 one; and that the fourth section of the second 13 article of the Constitution, which provides, "that 14 the election of Governor, Senators, and Rep-15 resentatives, shall be on the second Monday of 16 September annually forever," shall be so altered

17 and amended, that said election shall be held
18 on the first Monday in May annually, from and
19 after the first Monday of May, in the year of
20 our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty
21 one. Provided, that a majority of the inhab22 itants of this State, who are constitutionally
23 qualified to vote for State officers, shall at their
24 next annual meeting, on the second Monday of
25 September next, decide in favor of such amend26 ments.

Resolved, That it shall be the duty of the Se2 lectmen of the several towns, Aldermen of cities,
3 and Assessors of plantations, in this State, to
4 insert an article in their warrants respectively,
5 in which the annual meetings in September
6 next, shall be notified and called, to require the
7 inhabitants constitutionally qualified to vote as
8 aforesaid, to give in their votes on the question,
9 whether the proposed amendments to the Con10 stitution shall be made. And it shall be the
11 duty of said Selectmen, Aldermen, and Asses12 sors to receive the votes of said inhabitants in
13 such manner as a majority thereof shall decide;
14 and it shall be the duty of the Clerks of the

15 towns, cities, and plantations respectively, to 16 make a true record of the votes so received and 17 counted, and to make a fair copy of the same, 18 which shall be duly attested by the said Select-19 men and Clerks of towns, Aldermen and Clerks 20 of cities, and Assessors and Clerks of planta-21 tions, and sealed up in open meeting; and the 22 town, city, and plantation Clerks respectively, 23 shall cause the same to be delivered into the 24 Secretary of State's office, twenty days at least 25 before the first Wednesday of January, in the 26 year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred 27 and forty, for the purpose of being laid before 28 the Legislature; and if it shall be found that a 29 majority of the votes so returned shall be in favor 30 of the amendments, proposed as aforesaid, said 31 amendments shall be considered as adopted, 32 and shall form a part of the Constitution of 33 this State.

Resolved, That the Secretary of State shall 2 cause this Resolve to be published in all the 3 newspapers printed in this State, for three 4 weeks at least before the second Monday of 5 September next, and also cause copies thereof, 6 with a suitable form of return, to be sent forth-

- 7 with to the Selectmen of all the towns, to the
- 8 Assessors of all the plantations, and to the Al-
- 9 dermen of the cities, in this State. And said
- 10 Secretary shall, as early as may be in the next
- 11 session of the Legislature, lay all said returns
- 12 before said Legislature, with an abstract thereof
- 13 showing the number and state of the votes.
