STATE OF MARNE.

RESOLVE in aid of rebuilding the Bethel, Rumford and Canton Point Bridges.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appro-

2 priated to the Proprietors of Bethel Bridge,

3 Rumford Bridge and Canton Point Bridge, for

4 the rebuilding of said Bridges, ten thousand

5 acres of land off of the east half of Township

6 number two in the sixth Range of Townships

7 in the County of Franklin, to be apportioned

8 among the Proprietors of said Bridges as fol-

9 lows: To the Proprietors of Bethel Bridge,

10 three thousand acres; to the Proprietors of

11 Rumford Bridge, three thousand acres; and to

12 the Proprietors of Canton Point Bridge, four

13 thousand acres.

Resolved, That the foregoing resolve shall

2 take effect in relation to each of said Bridges

3 whenever it shall be made to appear to the

BRIDGES.

4 Board of Internal Improvements of this State, 5 and be certified by them that said Bridge 6 is rebuilt and made safe and convenient for

7 travelling.

Resolved, That it shall be the duty of the 2 Proprietors of each of said Bridges to keep a 3 full and exact account of the expense of rebuild-4 ing the same, and also of the future expenses 5 and income thereof, to be exhibited to the Leg-6 islature whenever required. And whenever 7 the profits of either of said Bridges shall amount 8 to a sum sufficient to repay the expenses incur-9 red by the Proprietors thereof, with interest, 10 then said Bridge shall become the property of 11 the State.
