IN SENATE, MAY 25, 1842.

The Joint Select Committee to which was referred the subject of Districting the State for nine and ten Representatives to Congress, have had the same under consideration, and ask leave to report a bill which is herewith submitted.

STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND FORTY TWO.

AN ACT additional to an act providing for the choice of Representatives to Congress, approved March 17, 1842.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. If congress fix upon such a ratio

2 of representation under the sixth census as will
3 entitle this State to nine Representatives to con4 gress, they shall be elected by Districts, as fol5 lows :---

6 The county of York shall compose the *First*7 *District* and be entitled to one Representative.

8 The county of Cumberland with the exception
9 of Durham, Brunswick, Harpswell, Danville,
10 Minot and Auburn, shall compose the second
11 District and be entitled to one Representative.

12 The county of Kennebec with the exception 13 of Albion, Winslow, China, Vassalboro', Wind-14 sor, Clinton, Clinton Gore, Dearborn, Water-15 ville, and territory north of Albion, together with 16 the following towns from the county of Cumber-17 land, to wit: Durham, Brunswick, Harpswell, 18 Danville, Minot and Auburn, and the following 19 towns from the county of Lincoln, to wit: Lew-20 iston, Lisbon, Webster and Bowdoin, shall com-21 pose the third District and be entitled to one 22 Representative.

23 The remainder of the county of Lincoln shall24 compose the fourth District and be entitled to25 one Representative.

26 The counties of Oxford and Franklin shall

27 compose the fifth District and be entitled to one28 Representative.

The counties of Somerset and Piscataquis to-30 gether with Clinton, Waterville, Dearborn, Clin-31 ton Gore, and the territory north of Albion, shall 32 compose the sixth District and be entitled to one 33 Representative.

34 The county of Waldo together with Albion,
35 Winslow, China, Vassalborough and Windsor,
36 shall compose the seventh District and be enti37 tled to one Representative.

38 The counties of Penobscot and Aroostook39 shall compose the eighth District and be entitled40 to one Representative.

41 The counties of Hancock and Washington42 shall compose the ninth District and be entitled43 to one Representative.

SECT. 2. If Congress fix upon such a ratio as 2 will entitle this State to ten Representatives to 3 Congress, they shall be elected by Districts, as 4 follows—

5 York county shall compose one District and 6 be entitled to one Representative.

7 Cumberland county, with the exception of8 Minot, Auburn, Danville, Pownal, Durham,9 Harpswell, Brunswick, Freeport, North Yar-

10 mouth, Cumberland and Falmouth, together with
11 the following towns from the county of Oxford,
12 to wit: Porter, Hiram, Brownfield, and Den13 mark, shall compose the second District and be
14 entitled to one Representative.

15 The remainder of the county of Oxford and16 the county of Franklin shall compose the third17 District, and be entitled to one Representative.

18 The several towns in the county of Cumber-19 land not included in the second District, together 20 with all that part of Lincoln county which lies 21 west of the Kennebec river, except the town of 22 Phipsburg, together with the towns of Greene, 23 Wales, Litchfield, Leeds and Monmouth, in the 24 county of Kennebec, shall compose the fourth 25 District and be entitled to one Representative.

26 The remaining part of Lincoln county shall 27 compose the fifth District and be entitled to one 28 Representative.

29 The remaining part of the county of Kenne-30 bec with the exception of Clinton, Albion, Chi-31 na, Clinton Gore and territory north of Albion, 32 together with the towns of Fairfield, Smithfield, 33 Bloomfield, Mercer, Skowhegan and Starks, in 34 the county of Somerset, shall compose the sixth 35 District and be entitled to one Representative.
36 The county of Waldo, together with Clinton,
37 Albion, China, Clinton Gore, and the territory
38 north of Albion in the county of Kennebec, shall
39 compose the seventh District, and be entitled to
40 one Representative.

41 The county of Penobscot, with the exception
42 of so much thereof north of the south lines of
43 townships letter A, shall compose the eighth
44 District, and be entitled to one Representative.

45 The counties of Hancock and Washington46 shall compose the ninth District and be entitled47 to one Representative.

48 The counties of Piscataquis and Aroostook
49 together with the remainders of the counties of
50 Somerset and Penobscot shall compose the tenth
51 District, and be entitled to one Representative.

52 The Representatives chosen in the several 53 Districts shall at the time of their election be 54 residents therein. The foregoing division of the 55 State into Representative Districts shall be and 56 continue in force until an apportionment of Rep-57 resentatives among the several States shall be 58 made by Congress after the taking of the seventh

59 census: provided, the ratio which may be estab-60 lished in apportioning Representatives according 61 to the sixth census shall be such as to entitle this 62 State to the aforesaid numbers of nine, or ten 63 Representatives.

SECT. 3. The election for representatives to 2 Congress shall take place and be on the second 3 Monday of September, one thousand eight hun-4 dred and forty-two, and thereafter biennially.

SECT. 4. So much of section three of an act 2 entitled "an act providing for the choice of rep-3 resentatives to Congress," approved February 4 twenty-eighth, A. D. eighteen hundred and thir-5 ty-three, as relates to the manner of calling 6 meetings for the choice of representatives to 7 Congress, and the duties of officers of towns in 8 presiding in said meetings and making returns 9 of votes, and also sections four, five, six and sev-10 en of said act, shall continue and be in force, 11 except so far as the same may have been chang-12 ed by the Revised Statutes of this State.

SECT. 5. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent 2 with this act, are hereby repealed.
