### STATE OF MAINE.

In Senate, Feb. 21, 1843.

ORDERED, that the Secretary of State be directed to prepare an abstract of the returns made to his office, by the Clerks of the Judicial Courts, relative to the business of the Supreme Court, under the several orders passed by the Senate and House during their present session, and cause 300 copies of the same to be printed for the use of the Legislature.

ORDERED, That the Secretary of State be directed to obtain from the Clerks of the Courts of the several counties, a certificate of the number of jury trials in each County, for each of the last five years, and also a certificate of the number of cases of law argued each year in the Supreme Judicial Court, for each of the last five years, and report the same to this House.

### STATE OF MAINE.

IN SENATE, FEBRUARY 13, 1843.

ORDERED, That the Secretary of State be directed to address letters forthwith to the Clerks of the Courts of the several counties, propounding to them the following questions, and transmit to the Senate such answers as he may receive.

First. How many days in each year from 1836 to 1842, inclusive, has the Supreme Court been in session in the several counties, excluding the number of days employed in the hearing of arguments upon points of law?

Second. Of the whole number of law questions argued orally and in writing during the law circuit of 1842, what proportion was decided immediately upon the hearing and what proportion remained undecided on the first day of the present month?

Third. How many law questions remain on the Docket of the Supreme Court agreed to be argued in writing?

N. B. From the nature of the questions, and the manner of keeping dockets, definite and accurate answers cannot well be given to the several questions proposed by the Senate; but the answers here given, conform to the facts as near as the circumstances of the case will admit. In answer to the last question, it is stated that only six cases stand on the docket to be argued in writing—this might lead to a wrong inference,—six cases are all that are agreed to be argued in writing, and are so marked on the docket, but there are about fifty actions now upon the law docket, which are yet to be argued either orally or in writing.

The dockets however, do show the number of new law cases brought before the full court at each law term, and the above table exhibits that information.
