ANACT

IN RELATION TO THE

KENNEBEC LOG DRIVING COMPANY.



STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND FORTY-THREE.

AN ACT amendatory to an act entitled an act to incorporate the Kennebec Log Driving Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-2 tives in Legislature assembled—as follows:

Section 1. The Kennebec Log Driving Com-

2 pany shall drive all logs and other timber belonging

3 to said company, or any of the members thereof, that

4 may be in the Kennebec river for that purpose,

5 commencing at the outlet of said river at Moosehead

6 Lake, to such place of destination on said river, as

7 may be designated by the owners thereof, such

8 place not to be below the Kennebec Bridge at Au-

9 gusta, at as early a period as practicable. And said

10 company may, for the purposes aforesaid, remove

11 obstructions, break jambs, and erect booms, where

12 the same may be lawfully done, and shall have all the

13 powers and privileges, and be subject to all the liabil-

14 ities incident to corporations of a similar nature.

Sec. 2. The officers of said company shall be a 2 Clerk, Treasurer, and a board of five Directors, three

3 of whom shall be a quorum, to transact business, and
4 a master driver or drivers, and such other officers as
5 may be deemed necessary by the members at their
6 annual meeting, all of whom shall hold their offices
7 until the next annual meeting following their election,
8 and until others be chosen in their stead. And the
9 Clerk and Directors shall be sworn to the faithful
10 performance of their duties. And the Treasurer
11 shall give a good and sufficient bend to be approved
12 by the Directors before entering upon the discharge
13 of his duties. And the Directors shall at their first
14 meeting elect one of their number, who shall be
15 the President of said company, and no member shall
16 hold more than one office in said company at the same
17 time.

Sec. 3. The Clerk and Treasurer of the compa2 ny shall at the next annual meeting and at all future
3 annual meetings, lay before the members a full account
4 of the doings of said company for the preceding year,
5 showing the whole amount of receipts and expendi6 tures, the source whence all receipts are derived, the
7 amount of all claims against the company, and the
8 nature of them. Also the amount of debts due to
9 said company, and from whom they are due. Also
10 stating the amount due or paid to each officer and
11 agent the preceding year, the nature of the services
12 performed, and the number of days they have each
13 been employed, said accounts to be audited and ap14 proved by the Directors and duly sworn to by said

15 Clerk and Treasurer. Said account shall be the 16 first business to be acted upon at the annual meeting 17 after it is organized. And before proceeding to a 18 choice of officers, the compensation of each officer, 19 agent or driver, shall first be fixed by a vote of the 20 meeting. And the compensation, as fixed, shall in-21 clude all charges to be made by such officer, agent or 22 driver, during his continuance in office. All compensation for extra services rendered by any officer, agent 24 or driver, shall be laid before the directors for allowance, and shall be reported by them to the next 26 annual meeting. The by-laws of said company 27 shall be laid before the next annual meeting for revi-28 sion; and the same shall be done at each future 29 annual meeting.

Sec. 4. A committee shall be chosen at each an2 nual meeting, who shall be authorized whenever they
3 shall judge the interest of the log owners to require
4 it, to collect and secure all logs and other timber
5 which may drift below the Chops, so called, on said
6 river. And for all expenses incurred by said com7 mittee a lien is hereby created upon all logs and other
8 timber so secured, and said committee shall be au9 thorized to assess upon all such logs and other timber,
10 a tax sufficient to pay such expense; and if such tax
11 is not paid or secured within thirty days after it is
12 assessed, they shall proceed to sell and dispose of a
13 sufficient quantity of such logs and other timber, to
14 pay said tax, in the same manner as is hereinafter

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15 provided for the sale of logs for delinquent assess16 ments laid by the Directors for driving expenses.
17 All proceeds of said sales shall be paid into the Trea18 sury of said company. The assessments provided
19 for in this section shall be handed to the Treasurer,
20 with a warrant under the hands of said committee in
21 due form. And said Treasurer shall proceed to col22 lect the same in the same manner as is provided in
23 the eighth section of this act, all sales of logs under
24 the authority of this section shall be at the office of
25 said company and at public auction.

Sec. 5. All logs or other timber not having thereon 2 some mark designating the owner or owners thereof, 3 shall be the property of said company; and said logs 4 and other timber shall be disposed of in such manner 5 and at such times and places as shall be determined 6 upon at the annual meeting, and at each annual meet-7 ing, it shall be the duty of the members to prescribe 8 the method to be pursued in the collection and dis-9 posal of all such logs and other timber the year ensu-10 ing, the proceeds of all sales of such logs and other 11 timber shall be paid into the treasury of said company 12 to defray expenses. Provided however, nothing in 13 this or the following section shall be construed to im-14 pair the right of any person to claim any log or other 15 timber which he may have put into said river, with-16 out such mark of ownership. And any such person 17 upon furnishing reasonable proof of such ownership, 18 shall be entitled to receive all logs which he may so

19 prove to be his, or to receive the proceeds of the sale 20 of the same, provided they have been sold by said 21 company, all such claims to be made and proof to be 22 furnished within one year from the date of the sale of 23 the same by the company.

Sec. 6. It shall not be lawful for any person or 2 corporation, other than the Kennebec Log Driving 3 Company, to mark or cause to be marked, any log 4 or other timber put into said river, or its tributaries, 5 usually called prize logs. And any person or persons, 6 or corporation, other than the Kennebec Log Driv-7 ing Company, who shall drive his or their own logs 8 down said river, and shall furnish reasonable proof 9 thereof within the year, such logs were driven, to-10 gether with the number of feet thus driven, to the 11 the Directors of said company, it shall be the duty of 12 said Directors to apportion to such owner or owners 13 a just proportional share of the nett proceeds of all 14 prize logs or other prize timber sold by said company, 15 the year such logs may have been driven. 16 however, nothing in this Act shall be construed to im-17 pair the exclusive right of said company to control and 18 dispose of all the prize logs and prize timber in said 19 river, or its tributaries. And if any person or cor-20 poration, except the owner thereof, shall take and 21 carry away or otherwise convert to his or their use, 22 without the consent of said company, any prize log or 23 prize timber, he or they shall be subject to all the lia-24 bilities provided for similar offences in the laws of the 25 State, which specially provide for securing to owners

26 their property in logs, masts, spars and other timber. Sec. 7. The number of said company at any 2 time owning logs or timber on said river, or its tribu-3 taries, or lying on the banks or shores thereof, and 4 intended to be driven down said river, between 5 Moosehead lake and the Augusta Bridge, or any part 6 of that distance, shall on or before the tenth day of 7 June, in that year, file with the Clerk a statement in 8 writing signed by such owner or owners, his or their 9 authorized agent, of all such logs or timber, of the 10 number of feet board measure, of all such logs and 11 other timber, and the mark thereon, and what por-12 tion thereof has been driven by said company, and 13 the Directors, or one of them, shall require such 14 owner or owners, or agents presenting such statement, 15 to make oath that the same is in his or their judg-16 ment and belief, true, which oath the Directors, or 17 either of them are hereby empowered to administer. 18 And if any owner shall neglect or refuse to file a 19 statement in the manner herein prescribed, the Direc-20 tors may assess such delinquent or delinquents for his-21 or their proportion of such expenses, such sum or 22 sums as may be by the Directors considered just and 23 equitable. And the Directors shall give public notice 24 of the time and place of making such assessments by

25 publishing the same in some newspaper printed in 26 Augusta, Bath and Portland, two weeks in succes-27 sion, the last publication to be before making such 28 assessments. And any assessment or assessments 29 when the owner or owners of any mark of logs or oth-30 er timber, is unknown to the Directors, may be set 31 to the mark upon such logs or other timber. And 32 the Directors shall keep a record of all assessments 33 made by them which shall at all times be open to all 34 persons interested.

Sec. 8. The directors shall give the treasurer a 2 list of all assessments by them made with a warrant 3 in due form under their hands. And said company 4 shall have a lien on all logs and other timber by them 5 driven for the expenses of driving the same, which 6 may be discharged by sufficient bond being given to 7 the company conditional that all such expenses shall 8 be seasonably paid. And it shall be the duty of the 9 treasurer, within ten days after he shall receive from 10 the directors a list of assessments in due form-to 11 notify in writing all the owners where known, of the 12 amount assessed upon their several marks, and when 13 the owner or owners of any marks of logs or other 14 timber are unknown, he shall within ten days publish 15 a list of all such marks of logs and timber with the 16 amount assessed upon each mark in some newspaper 17 printed in Bath, Portland and Augusta, three weeks 18 successively. And all owners of logs and other tim-19 ber, shall be required to pay or satisfactorily secure 20 the amount of their several assessments within thirty 21 days from the date of such assessment. And the 22 Treasurer shall have power to take possession of a 23 sufficient quantity of any and all marks of logs upon 24 which the assessment has not been so paid or secured 25 at the end of thirty days from such assessment, and 26 shall retain possession of the same until disposed of as 27 hereinafter provided. And all marks upon which 28 such assessment shall not be thus paid or secured 29 within the time herein specified, shall be advertised 30 two weeks in succession in some newspaper printed 31 in Bath, Augusta and Portland, and if not paid with-32 in ten days after the last publication, with necessary 33 costs, the Treasurer shall then advertise them for sale 34 at public auction, by posting up in some conspicuous 35 place in Bath, Gardiner, Augusta and Waterville, a 36 notice of such sale, with a list of all the marks, and 37 the amount of assessment upon each mark, ten days be-38 fore the day of sale, and unless such assessments with 39 all expenses incurred are previously paid, he shall 40 then proceed to sell to the highest bidder, a sufficient 41 quantity of the logs or other timber of the different 42 marks upon the list, to pay such assessments, with all 43 proper costs, selling each mark separately. The 44 place of sale to be at the office of the company, and 45 the proceeds of all sales to be paid into the treasury 46 of the company.

Sec. 9. Any owner or owners of logs or other 2 timber on said river, or its tributaries, may take and 3 use on his or their logs, or other timber, any mark 4 not before used by any other person on said river, or 5 its tributaries, and such mark shall be left with the

6 Clerk of said company, and shall be by him recorded

7 in a book to be kept by him for that purpose, which

8 shall be at all times open to the inspection of all per-

9 sons interested; and if any other person or corpora-

10 tion shall use such mark on any logs or other timber

11 on said river, or its arbitraries, after such mark shall

12 be so recorded, such offender or offenders shall forfeit

13 and pay twenty dollars for every such offence, to be

14 recovered by action in any court competent to try the

15 same, to the use of the person prosecuting therefor.

Sec. 10. All persons who shall undertake to

2 drive their own logs or other timber down said river,

3 or any part thereof, shall furnish all necessary men,

4 tools, and other apparatus, for the efficient driving

5 said logs, so as not to interfere with the driving of

6 logs by said company.

Sec. 11. It shall be the duty of the master driver

2 or drivers, to drive all logs or other timber, to the

3 Bridge at Augusta, unless he or they shall be season-

4 ably notified by the owner or owners, of their wish to

5 have them stopped at any place above said bridge.

6 And it shall be the duty of all boom owners or agents,

7 or other persons engaged in stopping, booming, rafting

8 or securing any such logs or other timber, at any place

9 above said bridge, to furnish said driver or drivers,

10 whenever requested, his or their written authority for

11 stopping any such logs or other timber. And when

12 such written authority, or other sufficient proof of his or

13 their authority to stop any such logs or other timber,

14 is not produced, the driver or drivers may proceed to 15 turn out and drive to said bridge at Augusta, all such 16 logs and other timber. And if any boom owner or 17 owners, or agents, or any other person or persons en-18 gaged in stopping or securing logs or timber, above 19 said bridge, shall stop or detain any logs or other tim-20 ber, without the consent of the owners thereof, and 21 if they shall detain the same for the space of twenty-22 four hours or more, said boom owner or agent, or 23 other person, so offending, shall forfeit and pay one 24 dollar for each and every log so stopped or detained, 25 to be recovered in an action of trespass. And it 26 shall be the duty of all said boom owners or agents, 27 or other persons, to turn out all such logs or other 28 timber, as may drift into any such boom or raft, or 29 get into said boom or raft in any way, each day, and 30 as early in the day as practicable.

SEC. 12. Said company shall have no control 2 over any logs or other timber, after they are driven 3 to said bridge. Provided however, nothing in this 4 Act contained, shall be construed to impair their lien 5 upon all logs or timber they may have thus driven for 6 all driving expenses, nor their full and perfect control 7 over all prize logs or prize timber, or their authority 8 as contained in the fourth section of this Act.

Sec. 13. It shall be the duty of the master driv-2 er to keep a separate and distinct account of all 3 expenses incurred for driving the logs and other 4 timber, between Moosehead lake and the Forks of

- 5 Kennebec river. And the Directors shall in the
- 6 manner prescribed in this Act, ascertain the number
- 7 and ownership of the logs and other timber, between
- S the points aforesaid, and shall assess thereon a dis-
- 9 tinct and separate tax, sufficient to pay all such ex-10 penses.
 - Sec. 14. Any person may become a member of
 - 2 this company, who is an owner or interested in logs
 - 3 or other timber on said river or its tributaries, by
 - 4 leaving with the clerk a written request to that effect,
 - 5 which shall be by him recorded and kept on file.
 - 6 And any person may withdraw from said company
 - 7 by filing with the clerk a request for that purpose,
 - 8 which shall likewise be kept on file and recorded by
 - 9 said clerk; such member first paying or securing all
- 10 debts and assessments due said company.
 - Sec. 15. The private property of all individuals
 - 2 of said company shall be holden to pay all debts con-
 - 3 tracted by said company after he became a member
 - 4 thereof, and before his withdrawal from the same, in
 - 5 default of company property whereon execution may
 - 6 be satisfied.
 - Sec. 16. All Acts and parts of Acts, so far as
 - 2 they relate to driving logs and other timber on said
 - 3 river, or its tributaries, be and the same are hereby
 - 4 repealed; and this Act shall take effect and be in
 - 5 force from the time it shall be approved.
