STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVES in relation to the introduction and extension of slavery in newly acquired territory.

Resolved, That we hereby declare, for ourselves and 2 in behalf of the people of this state, our uncompro-3 mising opposition to the extension of slavery into any 4 territory of the United States which is now free.

Resolved, That in organizing governments for New 2 Mexico and California, the introduction and existence 3 of slavery in those territories, shoud be positively pro-4 hibited by act of congress.

Resolved, That our senators in congress are hereby 2 instructed and our representatives requested, to vote 3 against any act establishing governments for said ter-4 ritories, that does not contain an express prohibition of -5 slavery.

Resolved, That the governor be requested to forward 2 copies of the foregoing resolutions to each of our 3 senators and representatives in congress, and to each 4 of the governors of the several states of the Union. .
