## STATE OF MAINE.

**RESOLVES** in relation to our Navigation Laws.

Resolved, That any alteration in our navigation 2 laws, as asked for by the British government and 3 urged with so much zeal by those who passed the 4 tariff act of 1846—by which labor is deprived of its 5 just reward, would affect the general business of this 6 state by destroying the interest engaged in ship 7 building and navigation.

Resolved, That our senators and representatives in 2 congress be requested to oppose any alteration in our 3 navigation laws which would concede to British built 4 ships any part of our coasting trade; and that they 5 be requested to oppose any law or treaty which would

6 give to British built ships American registers when7 bought by American citizens.

Resolved, That the governor be requested to forward 2 copies of the foregoing resolutions to our senators 3 and representatives in congress, from this state.
