### STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND FIFTY.

AN ACT to incorporate the town of Kennebec.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. The territory included within the fol-

- 2 lowing described boundaries, to wit: beginning on
- 3 the north line of Augusta, and on the west line of a
- 4 gore at the end of the third mile from Kennebec river,
- 5 thence southerly on the west line of said gore to land
- 6 of Bethiah Knowles, thence easterly on the north line
- 7 of said Knowles' to land of Sewall Longfellow,
- 8 thence to the east line of said gore, thence southerly,

9 on the east line of said Longfellow's to land of Wil-10 liam Goldthwait, easterly on the north line of 11 said Goldthwait, to the north east corner of said 12 Goldthwait land, thence southerly on the east line 13 of said Goldthwait, and on the line of land owned 14 by Timothy Goldthwait, Jr., to land of the late Salmon 15 Rockwood, thence easterly on the north line of said 16 Rockwood, to said Rockwood's north east corner, 17 thence southerly to the north west corner of land 18 owned by Peter Atherton in Hallowell, thence 19 southerly, to the south west corner of a piece of land 20 which Doctor Elias Weld conveyed to Winslow 21 Hawkes, thence southwesterly, until it strikes Jimmy's 22 stream at the point where it intersects the north line 23 of the great five mile lot, number twenty-two, as sur-24 veyed by Solomon Adams, thence along said stream 25 to Jimmy's pond, thence down said pond to the out-26 let, thence following the outlet of said pond to Huch-27 inson's pond, thence south, twenty-two and a half de-28 grees west, to the south line of Hallowell, thence 39 westerly, on the south line of Hallowell, until it strikes 30 Gardiner stream, and across said stream to the south 31 line of land owned by John Collins in Litchfield, 32 thence westerly on the south line of said Collins' land, 33 and by that line extended, until it strikes a point in 34 Winthrop pond, due south of the south east corner of 35 land owed by Francis Fuller in Winthrop, thence run-36 ning due north to said south east corner of said Ful-37 ler's land, thence northerly on the east line of said 38 Fuller's land, thence by the east line of Capt. Shaw's 39 land, to Richards' pond, thence across said pond to 40 the west line of land owned by Samuel Richards, on 41 the north line of said pond, thence northerly on the 42 west line of land owned by Oren Brainard, and also 43 by the west line of land formerly owned by James 44 Brainard, to land owned by Elisha Case in Readfield, 45 thence westerly, on the south line of said Case to 46 said Case's south west corner, thence northerly on 47 said Case's west line, to the land of J. Whiting Wins-48 low, thence northerly on the west line of said Wins-49 low to said Winslow's north west corner, thence 50 easterly to land of the widow Carr, thence northerly 51 on the west line of said Carr, and the west line of land 52 owned by the widow Adams, William Taylor, Joseph 53 Knowles, Eliab Lyon, Jr., Elisha Prescott, Stephen 54 Hill and William Hill, to the north line of Readfield, 55 thence easterly on the north line of Readfield to the 56 north west corner of Augusta, thence easterly on the 57 north line of Augusta to the bounds first mentioned, 58 be and hereby is incorporated into a town by the 59 name of Kennebec, and the inhabitants thereof are 60 hereby vested with all the powers, privileges and im-61 munities, which the inhabitants of other towns within 62 this state, do or may by law enjoy.

Sec. 2. All persons now chargeable as paupers to 2 Augusta, Hallowell, Winthrop, Readfield and Litch-3 field, who reside within the limits of the town of Ken-4 nebec hereby created, or who, if supported at a poor 5 house, in the city of Augusta, or in either of the said 6 other four towns, resided within the limits of the said 7 town of Kennebec, when transferred to such poor 8 house, or who, if supported by said city or either of 9 said other four towns in any other town or place, did 10 at the time of their last residence within the towns 11 supporting them, reside within the limits of the town 12 of Kennebec, shall from and after the close of the 13 current municipal year be chargeable to the town of 14 Kennebec.

Sec. 3. The polls and estate, real or personal, with-

- 2 in the limits of said town of Kennebec, assessed prior
- 3 to the time when this act is to take effect, shall be
- 4 held liable for the same, as if this act had not passed,
- 5 reserving and applying for the use of the inhabitants
- 6 of said town of Kennebec their just proportion of the
- 7 school money during the current municipal year.
- 8 And the fire engine and apparatus now at the Forks
- 9 in Hallowell, is to be the property of the town of
- 10 Kennebec. The highways also in said town of Ken-
- 11 nebec, during the current municipal year, are to re-
- 12 main chargeable respectively to the city and towns
- 13 from which said new town is taken.
  - Sec. 4. Any justice of the peace for the county of
  - 2 Kennebec, may issue his warrant to any inhabitant of
  - 3 the new town hereby created, directing him to notify
  - 4 the first meeting of the inhabitants thereof for the
  - 5 transaction of town business, at such time and place
  - 6 as such justice may think proper.
  - Sec. 5. This act shall take effect from and after
  - 2 the fifteenth of September next.
