AMENDMENT offered by Mr. CARY, to the Resolve in support of the Memorial to Congress asking assistance from the United States government in behalf of the European and North American Railway.

Strike out all after the word "Resolved," and insert:

That the unjust imputation against the American

- 3 the British and French governments, that they had
- 4 placed their naval power at the disposal of Spain to
- 5 prevent the passage of American citizens from the
- 6 United States to Cuba in any future struggle of its
- 7 inhabitants to free themselves from the despotism of
- 8 Spain-has, in the opinion of the legislature of this
- 9 State, made it the duty of congress to arm the presi-
- 10 dent of the United States with sufficient naval power
