RESOLVE for dividing the State into districts for  
Senators.

---

*Resolved,* That from and after the passing of this  
2 resolve, the State be, and hereby is divided into thir-  
3 teen districts for the choice of senators, and each  
4 district shall be entitled to elect the number of sena-  
5 tors herein provided, for the term of ten years, in the  
6 manner prescribed by the constitution, to wit:

7 The several towns composing the county of York,  
8 shall form the first district, and be entitled to elect  
9 three senators.

10 The several towns composing the county of Cum-  
11 berland, shall form the second district, and be entitled  
12 to elect four senators.

13 The several towns and plantations composing the  
14 county of Lincoln, shall form the third district, and  
15 be entitled to elect four senators.

16 The several towns and plantations composing the  
17 county of Kennebec, (excepting the towns of Clinton,  
18 Benton, and Clinton gore,) shall form the fourth dis-  
19 trict, and be entitled to elect three senators.

20 The several towns and plantations composing the  
21 county of Waldo, shall form the fifth district, and be  
22 entitled to elect three senators.

23 The several towns and plantations composing the  
24 county of Hancock, shall form the sixth district, and  
25 be entitled to elect two senators.

26 The several towns and plantations composing the  
27 county of Washington, shall form the seventh dis-  
28 trict, and be entitled to elect two senators.

29 The several towns and plantations composing the  
30 county of Aroostook, shall form the eighth district, and  
31 be entitled to elect one senator.

32 The several towns and plantations composing the  
33 county of Penobscot, shall form the ninth district, and  
34 be entitled to elect three senators.

35 The several towns and plantations composing the  
36 county of Piscataquis, shall form the tenth district,  
37 and be entitled to elect one senator.

38 The several towns and plantations composing the  
39 county of Somerset, together with the towns of Clin-  
40 ton, Benton, and Clinton gore, shall form the eleventh  
41 district, and be entitled to elect two senators.

42 The several towns and plantations composing the  
43 county of Franklin, shall form the twelfth district, and  
44 be entitled to elect one senator.

45 The several towns and plantations composing the  
46 county of Oxford, shall form the thirteenth district,  
47 and be entitled to elect two senators.

*Resolved,* That from and after the passage of this  
2 resolve, the State be, and hereby is, divided into thir-  
3 teen districts for the choice of senators, and each dis-  
4 trict shall be entitled to elect the number of senators  
5 hereinafter provided, for the term of ten years, in the  
6 manner prescribed by the constitution, to wit :

7 The several towns composing the county of York,  
8 shall constitute the first district, and be entitled to  
9 elect three senators.

10 The several towns composing the county of Cum-  
11 berland, shall constitute the second district, and be  
12 entitled to elect four senators.

13 The several towns and plantations, composing the  
14 county of Lincoln, shall constitute the third district,  
15 and be entitled to elect four senators.

16 The several towns in the county of Kennebec, ex-  
17 cepting the towns of China, Clinton, Benton, Albion,  
18 and the territory in said county north of Albion, shall  
19 constitute the fourth senatorial district, and be entitled  
20 to elect three senators.

21 The several towns composing the county of Waldo,  
22 with the towns and territory in the county of Kenne-  
23 bec, excepted in the fourth district, shall constitute  
24 the fifth senatorial district, and be entitled to elect  
25 three senators.

26 The several towns and plantations composing the  
27 county of Hancock, shall constitute the sixth senato-  
28 rial district, and be entitled to elect two senators.

29 The several towns and plantations composing the  
30 county of Washington, shall constitute the seventh sen-  
31 atorial district, and be entitled to elect two senators.

32 The several towns and plantations composing the  
33 county of Aroostook, shall constitute the eighth sena-  
34 torial district, and be entitled to elect one senator.

35 The several towns and plantations in the county of



36 Penobscot, shall constitute the ninth senatorial dis-  
37 trict, and be entitled to elect three senators.

38 The several towns and plantations composing the  
39 county of Piscataquis, shall constitute the tenth sena-  
40 torial district, and be entitled to elect one senator.

41 The several towns and plantations composing the  
42 county of Somerset, shall constitute the eleventh sen-  
43 atorial district, and be entitled to elect two senators.

44 The several towns and plantations composing the  
45 county of Franklin, shall constitute the twelfth sena-  
46 torial district, and be entitled to elect one senator.

47 The several towns and plantations composing  
48 the county of Oxford, shall constitute the thirteenth  
49 senatorial district, and be entitled to elect two sen-

26 and be entitled to two senators.

27 The several towns and plantations composing the  
28 county of Aroostook, shall form the eighth district,  
29 and be entitled to one senator.

30 The several towns and plantations composing the  
31 county of Penobscot, shall form the ninth district, and  
32 be entitled to three senators.

33 The several towns and plantations composing the  
34 county of Piscataquis, shall form the tenth district,  
35 and be entitled to one senator.

36 The several towns and plantations composing the  
37 county of Franklin, shall form the eleventh district,  
38 and be entitled to one senator.

39 The several towns and plantations in the county of  
40 Somerset, shall form the twelfth district, and be enti-  
41 tled to two senators.

42 The several towns and plantations in the county of  
43 Oxford, shall form the thirteenth district, and be enti-  
44 tled to two senators.
