STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVES in relation to the commercial interests of the State of Maine.

Whereas, the people of Maine are largely engaged 2 in commercial pursuits, especially in the carrying 3 trade between this and other countries, and in ship-4 building, and the various kinds of business connected 5 with and dependent on the same, therefore,

Resolved, That while we claim for this class of our 2 citizens no exclusive or special privileges, justice to 3 them demands that they should not be obstructed in 4 the full and free enjoyment of all the natural channels 5 of trade.

SENATE.-No. 51.

Resolved, That further appropriations by Congress 2 for the support of any of the lines of steamships now 3 established, or that may be hereafter established, 4 under the pretext of compensation for the transporta-5 tion of the mails, would be injurious to our citizens, 6 would have a direct tendency to foster and build up 7 one class of commercial interests to the prejudice of 8 all others, to discourage private enterprise and com-9 petition, and to create a monopoly dangerous and 10 anti-republican in its tendency.

Resolved, That our Senators and Representatives 2 in Congress, be requested to oppose any further 3 appropriations by Congress for the above objects.

Resolved, That the Governor be requested to trans-2 mit a copy of these resolutions to each of our Sena-3 tors and Representatives in Congress.
