STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND FIFTY-THREE.

AN ACT to establish a Stock and Experimental Farm.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. Within one year from the passage of
- 2 this act, there shall be purchased and put in operation,
- 3 in the manner hereinafter named, a Stock and Exper-
- 4 imental Farm, containing, as far as practicable, the
- 5 different varieties of soil, and so located as to be
- 6 conveniently accessible from the different parts of the
- 7 State; and there shall also be purchased such stock,
- 8 seeds and implements, as shall be necessary to com-
- 9 mence operations on said farm.

- Sect. 2. The Board of Agriculture shall have the
- 2 general supervision and direction of said farm, and
- 3 shall appoint a superintendent to take the immediate
- 4 direction and management thereof, at a salary not
- 5 exceeding six hundred dollars per annum; who shall
- 6 be subject to such regulations and directions as may
- 7 from time to time be prescribed by the Board.
- Sect. 3. It shall be the duty of the Superintendent
- 2 to conduct the operations and labor on said farm, in
- 3 such way, as shall in the most economical but
- 4 effective manner accomplish the object and design
- 5 thereof. He shall keep and breed the most improved
- 6 breeds of neat stock, sheep and swine, the progeny
- 7 of which, after reserving such of them as shall be
- 8 necessary for the farm, shall be annually distributed
 - 9 among the several incorporated Agricultural Societies
- 10 in the State, in the same ratio as the Annual dona-
- 11 tions are made from the State to the said incorporated
- 12 Societies.
 - Sect. 4. The Superintendent shall also cultivate
 - 2 the best varieties of fruits, grains, vegetables and
 - 3 grasses which are suitable and adapted to the soil and
 - 4 climate of Maine and shall institute experiments in
 - 5 order to test the acclimation of such fruits, grains,

- 6 vegetables and grasses as are new and desirable to be
- 7 propagated in the State, and ascertain what varieties
- 8 are preferable and shall distribute their products to
- 9 the several incorporated Agricultural Societies in the
- 10 same way and manner as provided for in the distribu-
- 11 tion of the various breeds of stock.
 - Sect. 5. The Superintendent shall also obtain and
 - 2 experiment in the use of the various Agricultural
 - 3 implements in order to test their practical utility and
 - 4 ascertain which shall be the most economical and
 - 5 advantageous for our farmers. He shall also institute
 - 6 such experiments with crops upon the different soils
 - 7 and with different modes of cultivation as he may
 - 8 deem advisable. He shall keep a daily journal of
 - 9 observations and farm transactions and make a quar-
- 10 terly report of the important parts of the same to the
- 11 Secretary of the Board of Agriculture and also a
- 12 summary annual report of the same to the Board.
 - Sect. 6. The sum of ten thousand dollars is here-
 - 2 by appropriated out of any monies in the Treasury not
 - 3 otherwise appropriated, to be expended in the purchase
 - 4 of said farm, establishing and stocking the same ac-
 - 5 cording to the provisions of this Act.

Sect. 7. The purchase of the farm, and of the stock

- 2 and farming implements, necessary, according to the
- 3 provisions of this Act, to commence operations thereon
- 4 shall be made by a board of three Commissioners, who
- 5 shall be appointed by the Governor, by and with the
- 6 advice and consent of the Council, and who shall be
- 7 paid for their services, a sum not exceeding two dollars
- 8 each for each day employed in the performance of
- 9 their duties, together with all sums actually paid by
- 10 them for travelling expenses and board while perform-
- 11 ing the duties of their commission.
 - Sect. 8. This Act shall take effect and be in force
 - 2 from and after its approval by the Governor.
