## COMMUNICATION.

> Land Office, Augusta, March 29, 1853. $\}$

Sir :-Having been directed, by a resolve of the Legislature of this State, to proceed to Massachusetts, for the purpose of obtaining from the authorities of that State, the terms on which she would convey to Maine her interest in all lands in this State; and having been unable to fully accomplish the object contemplated by said resolve, I have thought it proper to communicate to your Excellency the present aspect of the action of Massachusetts, that the information may be laid before the Legislature, before its adjournment, should your Excellency think proper so to do.

On my arrival in Boston, I learned that no power existed with any agent or commission of the Commonwealth to answer the proposition I was directed to submit, and that Legislative action was necessary to accomplish the object desired.

I immediately presented the subject to his Excellency Governor Clifford, who laid the communication and the Resolve of the Legislature of Maine before the Legislature of Massachusetts, and urged immediate action thereon.

The papers were referred to the Committee on Public Lands, and on the 10 th lastant that Committee reported to the Eonse of Represenvatives a bill her the ade of those lands, which bill is herembo maned.

Atres some dsumbiun, several amencments being Ofered, the adjeth wer rocomitted, and mat action, by the press of other bushess, delayed to the present time.

It will be seen that the second section of the bul mepord propdes thab belore maing my sales, such lands
 Agens and Commissumens shall ofer to the Stabe of Maine, on rearmable toms, the right to become the pure chaser thered I hore no doubt, therefore, that these lands wh be tendered to Nane, at a price which may be thought reasonable, but not in aeason to lay the proposition betore the Legishature at the present session.

The parties who atampted to purchase these lands last Decmber, when they were ofered to the pablic by sealed proposas, have succecied in closing a ontract for some fre hondred thousond acres; and the residue, about twelve homared thomsand wores, ara, it is understood, engaged to the sme parties, at the option of that State, unlese otherwise disposed of prov to September next.

It may, therfore, be important that Legisiative action be had at this time, in order to meet the proposition which may be submitted by the authorities of Massachusetts. His Excellency, ) Vey respectfully,

# COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS. 

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND FIFTY-THREE.

AN ACT for the sale of the Public Lands in Maine.
Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Cour: assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

SEOR. 1. The Lema Agent of this Commonwealth, with the conourance of the Commiskionars appointed by the Acts of 1850 , chapter 807 , ord the Acta of 1851, chapter 190, is hereb whtrowel to sell for such prics, and on such toman, as they may arem for the interaston the Conm monvealth, tat the thber ond lands, now wewaining unsold in the Etate of Mane, and beionging to this Commonwealth: providel, however, that in case of the saie of said timber mad lands, or of any part tineveof, on credit, the securty to be received tor the payment of the pure ohase money shall be made entively satisuactory to said Land Agent and Conmiscioners, wholy independent of any lien upon the said timber or lands.

Gecr. 2. Prion to making many sale of such lazde, or of
the timber thereon, as may now be held in severalty by Massachusetts, or jointly with the State of Maine, the Land Agent and Commissioners aforesaid, shall offer to the State of Maine, for such time, and on such terms as they shall deem reasonable, the first right to become the purchasers thereof.

Sect. 3. So much of the third section of the Act of 1851, chapter 190, as forbids the sale of the fee in the public lands, is hereby repealed.

Sect. 4. This Act shall take effect from and after its passage.
