STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVES in relation to the acts known as the Compromise Measures.

Resolved, That congress has no power under the 2 constitution to interfere with or control the domestic 3 institutions of the several states, and that such states 4 are the sole and proper judges of everything apper-5 taining to their own affairs, not prohibited by the 6 constitution; that all efforts of the abolitionists or 7 others made to induce congress to interfere with 8 questions of slavery, or to take incipient steps in 9 relation thereto, are calculated to lead to the most 10 alarming and dangerous consequences; and that all 11 such efforts have an inevitable tendency to diminish 12 the happiness of the people, and endanger the 13 stability and permanency of the Union, and ought

14 not to be countenanced by any friend of our political15 institutions.

Resolved, That the foregoing proposition covers, 2 and was intended to embrace the whole subject of 3 slavery agitation in congress; and therefore, the 4 state of Maine, standing on this national platform, 5 will abide by and adhere to a faithful execution of 6 the acts known as the compromise measures, settled 7 by the last congress; "the act for reclaiming fugi-8 tive from service or labor," included; which act 9 being designed to carry out an express provision of 10 the constitution, cannot, with fidelity thereto, be re-11 pealed, or so changed as to destroy or impair its 12 efficiency.

Resolved, That Maine will resist all attempts at 2 renewing, in congress or out of it, the agitation of 3 the slavery question under whatever shape or color 4 the attempt may be made.
