#### STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND FIFTY-FOUR.

#### AN ACT relating to the State Library.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. The books now belonging to the state.

- 2 and such as shall be hereafter purchased or received
- 3 by the state, shall be collected and kept in the south
- 4 wing of the capitol, and shall compose the state
- 5 library.
  - Sect. 2. The state library shall hereafter be under
- 2 the management and control of three trustees, who
- 3 shall be appointed by the governor, with the advice
- 4 and consent of the council, and who shall hold their
- 5 offices for the term of three years unless sooner re-
- 6 moved.

- Sect. 3. There shall be appointed by the governor 2 and council a librarian of the state library, who shall 3 hold his office for the term of three years unless 4 sooner removed, and who shall give bond to the state 5 in such sum and with such securities as shall be ap-6 proved by the governor and council for the faithful
- Sect. 4. The librarian shall receive in full for his 2 services an annual salary of six hundred dollars, to be 3 paid quarterly out of any moneys in the treasury not 4 otherwise appropriated.

7 performance of all the duties of his office.

- Sect. 5. The librarian, under the direction of the trustees, shall take charge of the library and all proparty belonging thereto, classify, number and arrange the books; prepare and keep a suitable catalogue of the books, maps and charts belonging to the library. Also keep a register of all books issued and returned at the times they shall be so issued and returned, and perform such other duties as may be imposed by law and the regulations of the trustees.
- SECT. 6. The library shall be kept open every day in 2 the year, Sundays and the usual public holidays except-3 ed, during usual business hours; at which times the

- 4 librarian, unless prevented by sickness, shall give his
- 5 constant personal attendance in the library.
  - Sect. 7. All sums of money appropriated, or which
- 2 shall hereafter be appropriated by the legislature, for
- 3 the purchase of books, shall be expended by the
- 4 librarian, under the direction of the trustees.
  - Sect. 8. It shall be the duty of the librarian to re-
- 2 port to the legislature, annually, in the month of Jan-
- 3 uary, the receipts and expenditures on account of the
- 4 library, with a list of all books, maps and charts ac-
- 5 quired since the last report, specifying those obtained
- 6 by exchange, donation or purchase; and those, if
- 7 any, which have been lost, or are missing, and make
- 8 such suggestions in relation to the library as may lead
- 9 to its improvement.
- Sect. 9. Books may be taken from the library by
- 2 the governor, members of the council and of the
- 3 legislature, judges of the judicial courts, secretary of
- 4 state, treasurer of the state, adjutant general, attorney
- 5 general and land agent; provided, that this privilege
- 6 to the members of the legislature shall be limited to
- 7 the time they may be in session.
- Sect. 10. No person authorized to take books
- 2 from the library, shall be permitted to have, at any

- 3 one time, more than three volumes, nor shall the
- 4 same be retained more than three weeks at a time;
- 5 and all shall be returned on or before the first day
- 6 of January, annually.
- Sect. 11. No law works of this or any other coun-
- 2 try, belonging to the library, excepting those of the
- 3 State of Maine, Vattemare's exchanges, or books
- 4 presented by the United States, or any other state,
- 5 shall be allowed to be removed from the library room,
- 6 except for the use of the two houses, and the com-
- 7 mittees at their committee rooms, during their sessions.
  - Sect. 12. Every person shall be answerable for all
- 2 damage done by him to any book, and in case of the
- 3 loss of a volume belonging to a set, the person an-
- 4 swerable therefor shall procure a new volume or pay
- 5 in money the value of the set.
- Sect. 13. Actions for the breach of said regulations
- 2 may be brought by the librarian in his own name for
- 3 the use of the state, and in case of his death or re-
- 4 moval from office, the action shall survive and be
- 5 prosecuted by his successor.
- Sect. 14. The governor may transmit to the gov-
- 2 ernors of the several states three copies of all the
- 3 laws and resolves published by order of the legislature,

- 4 one copy of all public douments printed and bound
- 5 by the like order, and one copy of the printed decis-
- 6 ions of the judicial courts.
  - Sect. 15. Chapter four of the revised statutes, en-
- 2 titled "Of the state library," also an act entlitled "An
- 3 act in addition to chapter four of the revised statutes
- 4 further regulating the state library," approved June
- 5 24, 1847, are hereby repealed.
