STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND FIFTY-FOUR.

AN ACT to establish an Experimental Farm.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section. 1. That one hundred acres, or as near
- 2 that quantity as may conveniently be appropriated, of
- 3 the lands belonging to this state, on which the Maine
- 4 Hospital for the insane is situated, be and hereby are
- 5 made by law, an experimental farm, for illustrating
- 6 and perfecting the theory and practice of agriculture,
- 7 in its various departments, as best adapted to the soils
- 8 and climate of this state.
 - Sect. 2. That the trustees of said hospital shall,
- 2 as soon as may be, appoint some suitable person
- 3 as supervisor, who shall have the general charge and

4 supervision of said farm, with power to lay out the 5 grounds, make drains, fences, walls, trellises and 6 arbors; manufacture and purchase manures and fer-7 tilizers; procure seeds, plants, fruit, and ornamental 8 trees and shrubbery, implements of husbandry, and 9 such other matters and things as may be necessary 10 for carrying on the operations of the farm in a man-11 ner to accomplish the objects of its institution. 12 shall, also, have power to establish a nursery for the 13 propagation of the best kind of fruit trees, shrubs, 14 vines, and floral plants, suitable for cultivation in 15 Maine; also, to lay out a garden for the raising of 16 culinary and other vegetables; and connected with 17 which, he may construct a green house, for the dis-18 semination of such exotic fruits and flowers as may 19 be advantageously cultivated in factories, work-shops, 20 houses, and other buildings, where uniform tempera-21 tures are maintained. Said supervisor may also 22 establish, in some suitable room of the hospital edifice, 23 an agricultural cabinet, for the deposit of seeds and 24 tubers, raised upon the farm or elsewhere; samples 25 of wool, flax, hemp, analyzed soils, lime, gypsum, 26 muck, marl, and other fertilizing agents; earths, min-27 erals, fossils, wood, shells, skeletons, models, books,

28 diagrams, and such other matters and things of popular 29 use and interest as may be produced on the farm, col-30 lected by the supervisor elsewhere, or contributed by 31 generous persons from any places whatsoever. 32 the collections of this cabinet, the supervisor shall 33 supply, at their requests, any members of the Legis-34 lature, during its annual session, with packages of 35 seeds, tubers, and scions, gratuitously, for distribution 36 in their several localities, in such quantities as the 37 farm may be able annually to supply. Said super-38 visor shall also have power, at his discretion, to pro-39 cure any new and improved kinds of horses, mules, 40 neat cattle, sheep, swine, and domestic fowls, for 41 breeding purposes, and loan them for use, or cause 42 their progeny to be distributed as extensively and 43 equitably into the several counties of the state as the 44 means of the farm will allow.

Sect. 3. The supervisor shall keep an account 2 current of all expenditures and receipts, and account 3 for the same to the trustees of the hospital at their 4 order. He shall draw no money from the treasury, 5 but by their consent. He shall, also, keep a diary 6 of all the operations and experiments, of importance, 7 on the farm, with such notes and observations as may

8 be of interest to the cause of agriculture; which diary 9 shall be open at all times for the inspection of the 10 trustees of the hospital, the members of the legisla-11 ture, and executive government, and of all visitors ad-12 mitted to the cabinet. He shall, also, submit a report 13 annually, in the month of January, to the legislature, 14 giving the true and faithful results of all the experi-15 ments and operations on the farm for the preceding 16 year, that may be of use or interest to the public 17 generally, and the farming community in particular, 18 together with such reflections and recommendations 19 as the operations and experiments shall annually sug-20 gest. And this report shall be prepared with a view 21 to publication, for the general benefit of the cause of 22 agriculture, horticulture, floriculture and the house-23 hold arts.

Sect. 4. In the products of the farm, the supervisor 2 shall have reference to the culinary and domestic 3 wants of the hospital which shall have the first right 4 to all such products. But these products, as often 5 as appropriated by the hospital steward, shall be 6 charged to the account of the hospital, at the ordinary market prices, and be placed by the hospital 8 treasurer to the credit of the farm. And whatever

9 else is produced which may not be required by the 10 hospital, the supervisor shall dispose of to the best ad-11 vantage, thus keeping an account of the entire avails 12 of the farm, delivering all money, or other values re-13 ceived, to said treasurer; it being the design of this 14 act that the farm shall receive annually from said 15 treasurer the annual value of its products, but that all 16 the profits arising from the operations of the farm 17 shall either accrue to the support of the hospital, or 18 be appropriated to improvements on the farm, ac-19 cording as said trustees shall at the time deem the 20 most necessary. In case the outlays and expenditures 21 on the farm shall, in any year, exceed the value of its 22 products for that year, the trustees of the hospital, in 23 their annual report to the governor and council, shall 24 make known the deficit for the consideration of the 25 legislature.

Sect. 5. That the patients in the hospital shall 2 have access to the walks, parterres, arbors, gardens, 3 fields, greenhouse and cabinet of said farm, by the 4 consent, and under the direction of the medical 5 superintendent of the hospital; and to such as are 6 able, both male and female, the superintendent shall

- 7 give useful employment to said patients, in any of
- 8 the departments of labor of which they are capable.
 - Sect. 6. Said supervisor shall hold his situation
- 2 during good behavior; shall give bonds satisfactory
- 3 to said trustees for the faithful discharge of his duty;
- 4 shall have power to employ such men and teams as
- 5 may be necessary to carry on the labors of the farm;
- 6 shall consult said trustees on all important operations;
- 7 and shall receive such compensation for his services
- 3 as may be agreed upon by himself and the trustees.
- Sect. 7. To enable the trustees and supervisor
- 2 aforesaid to make the seasonable outlays and pur-
- 3 chases necessary to accomplish the objects contem-
- 4 plated by this act, the sum of dollars is
- 5 hereby appropriated out of the treasury of this state;
- 6 and the governor is hereby authorized to draw his
- 7 warrant on the treasurer for that amount, to be
- 8 delivered to the treasurer of the Insane Hospital for
- 9 the benefit of the experimental farm, as hereinbefore
- 10 described.
 - Sect. 8 This act shall take effect from and after 2 its approval by the governor.
