STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUE LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND FIFTY-FOUR.

AN ACT to secure to married women their earnings.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Any married woman, who shall per-2 form personal labor or services, shall be entitled to 3 receive the wages due for the same, to her sole use 4 and benefit, free from all claims of her husband, his 5 assigns, or creditors. Such married woman shall 6 have power to collect such wages, and to give re-7 ceipts therefor; and she may commence and prose-8 cute suits for the recovery of the same, in her own 9 name.

SECT. 2. Any married woman shall be entitled to 2 sue for, in her own name, and to recover to her own

3 use, compensation for any and all injuries to her per4 son; and no discharge of any claim for such compen5 sation shall be valid, unless executed by her or by her
6 authority.

AMENDMENT.

A.

Insert at the end of section 2:

Provided however, that no husband shall be compelled to pay any costs that may accrue from any action authorized by this act, and that nothing herein contained shall be construed to deprive the husband of his right to the personal services of the wife, when he may require them at home or elsewhere.
