### STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED

AND FIFTY-FIVE.

AMENDMENTS to the Bill to incorporate the Maine State Seminary, proposed by Mr. Hill of Bangor.

Amend by inserting after Section 2:

Section 3. Whenever the said Trustees, having 2 accepted the provisions of this act, shall have raised 3 for the benefit of said seminary the sum of fifteen 4 thousand dollars, and shall show by satisfactory 5 evidence, to the Governor and Council, that they have 6 provided suitable lands for the buildings and other 7 purposes of the seminary, in a place approved by the 8 Governor and Council, and that such part of the said 9 fifteen thousand dollars as is not invested in such 10 lands and buildings thereon, is securely invested for 11 the benefit of the seminary, the Governor and Council Secures & Blaine, Printers.

12 shall draw a warrant on the Treasurer for the sum of 13 five thousand dollars, in favor of the said Trustees, 14 which sum they shall apply to the general purposes 15 of the institution, or to the increase of its permanent 16 fund; and whenever the Trustees shall produce to the 17 Governor and Council satisfactory evidence that upon 18 the site so procured, buildings are erected suitable for 19 the accommodation and the purposes of the seminary, 20 and that the same are ready to be used as a place for 21 the education of youth, they shall direct the Treasurer 22 of State to issue to the said Trustees, the scrip of the 23 State for the sum of ten thousand dollars, redeemable 24 in twenty years, bearing interest payable semi-annu-25 ally, at the rate of six per cent. per annum, which 26 scrip shall be placed to the credit of the Trustees in 27 the books of the Treasurer, and also deposited in the 28 Treasurer's office, in trust for the said Trustees; and 29 the interest shall semi-annually be paid to them, so 30 long as they shall, by a compliance with the provis-31 ions of this act, be entitled to receive the same; and at 32 the expiration of the said twenty years, the said scrip 33 shall be surrendered and cancelled, and new scrip for 34 the same amount, shall be issued for the same

- 35 purpose, to be managed in the same manner for a 36 second period of twenty years; and so on from one 37 period of twenty years to another, until such time as 38 the Governor and Council shall determine that it will 39 be for the interest of the State and of the Seminary, 40 that the same shall be invested for its benefit in some 41 other manner, which the Governor and Council shall 42 have authority to cause to be done.
- SECT. 4. At the time of each semi-annual payment 2 of the interest on the said scrip of ten thousand dol-3 lars, the President of the Board of Trustees shall be 4 required to certify to the Treasurer of State, that the 5 said Seminary for the preceding six months has been in 6 successful operation as a place for the education of 7 youth, and no payment of such interest shall be 8 made without such certificate shall be produced and 9 delivered to the Treasurer. If at any time the said 10 Seminary shall for the space of three years at a time 11 cease to be in successful operation as a place for the 12 education of youth, the said scrip of ten thousand 13 dollars and all arrears of interest shall be forfeited 14 and revert to the State.
  - Sect. 5. The Governor shall have the right to ap-

- 2 point one of the Trustees of said Seminary, who shall
- 3 hold his office for the same term of time as the other
- 4 members of the Board, and to supply any vacancy
- 5 that may from time to time occur in the place of such
- 6 Trustee by a new appointment, so that there shall
- 7 always be in the board of Trustees one member appoint-
- 8 ed by the Governor. The Governor shall also have the
- 9 right from time to time to nominate students, who shall
- 10 be entitled to receive the benefits of the Seminary tui-
- 11 tion free, not exceeding five in number at any one time.
- 12 In the nomination of such students, the Governor
- 13 shall give preference to persons seeking to qualify
- 14 themselves to be teachers of Common Schools.

Also, amend the sixth line of Section 3, in the printed bill, and the twelfth line of Section 4, by striking out the word "all" in each of those lines.

Also, to change the numbering of the Sections after Section 2, to correspond with the amendments proposed.
