STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND FIFTY-SIX.

AN ACT additional to an act to establish the State Reform School.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. No boy over the age of sixteen years, 2 shall hereafter be sentenced to, or received in, the 3 State Reform School.

SECT. 2. The trustees of said school shall have 2 power to discharge, as reformed, or for other cause 3 deemed by them sufficient, any boy committed to 4 their charge. They may also authorize the superin-5 tendent, under such rules and restrictions as they may 6 from time to time provide, to refuse to receive boys 7 sentenced to said school, and his certificate of his Fuller & Fuller, Printers.

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8 refusal shall have the same effect as if made by the9 trustees themselves.

SECT. 3. There is hereby appropriated for the sup-2 port of the library of said school, a sum of money, 3 annually, which shall be equal to six per centum upon 4 seven hundred dollars, the amount of the Sanford 5 legacy, in favor of said school, received by the state 6 treasurer in the year eighteen hundred and fifty-four.

SECT. 4. The treasurer of state shall, annually, in 2 the month of February, pay over to the treasurer of 3 said school, the sum appropriated by the third section 4 of this act, to be applied by the trustees as aforesaid.

SECT. 5. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with 2 the provisions hereof, are hereby repealed.

SECT. 6. This act shall take effect from and after 2 its approval by the governor.
