STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND FIFTY-SIX.

AN ACT regulating proceedings on demurrer.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. In all actions of law, whenever a 2 demurrer to the declaration is sustained, and the 3 declaration is adjudged defective, the plaintiff shall 4 have leave to amend his declaration, if legally amend-5 able, upon payment of the defendant's costs from the 6 time of filing the demurrer till the decision thereon. 7 And if the demurrer is overruled, the defendant shall 8 have leave to plead anew upon payment of the 9 plaintiff's costs from the time of filing the demurrer 10 to the decision thereon, unless the court shall adjudge

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11 the demurrer frivolous and intended merely for delay, 12 in which case judgment shall be rendered on the 13 demurrer. And such actions shall be continued on 14 the docket of the county where they are pending until 15 the next term after the determination of the issue 16 arising upon the demurrer shall be certified by the 17 clerk of the district to the clerk of the county. At 18 such term judgment shall be rendered upon the de-19 murrer, unless the terms of amending the declaration, 20 or of pleading anew, are complied with, and the 21 amendments or new pleadings filed on or before the 22 second day of said term. But in any action hereafter 23 to be entered in court, the defendant shall have no 24 benefit of this act, unless his demurrer shall be filed 25 at the first term.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect from and after 2 its approval by the governor.
