STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND FIFTY-SIX.

AN ACT for the regulation of Bowling Alleys.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. The mayor and aldermen of cities, and 2 the selectmen of towns, shall have authority to license 3 suitable persons to keep bowling alleys in their sever-4 al cities and towns, subject to such regulations as they 5 shall see fit from time to time to ordain, for which 6 license the person licensed shall pay a fee of ten dol-7 lars for the use of such city or town.

SECT. 2. Every person so licensed shall, at the time 2 he shall receive his license, give a bond to the city or 3 town in which he may be licensed, with two good and

4 sufficient sureties, in the sum of one hundred dollars,
5 conditioned that he will not suffer or permit any gam6 ing or drinking of intoxicating liquors in or about his
7 premises; and that he will not suffer or permit any
8 violation of any of the regulations that may be or9 dained as aforesaid.

SECT. 3. If any person, so licensed, shall violate 2 any of the conditions of said bond, it shall be the duty 3 of such mayor and aldermen or selectmen, on being 4 informed thereof and furnished with proof of such 5 violation, to revoke the license and put the bond of 6 such person in suit, and enforce the payment thereof 7 for the benefit of such city or town.

SECT. 4. If any person shall keep a bowling alley 2 without license, as provided for in the first section of 3 this act, he shall be punished for the first offense by 4 a fine of not less than ten nor more than twenty dollars, 5 on complaint before a justice of the peace, or a muni-6 cipal or police court, and for any subsequent offense, 7 committed within one year after a former conviction, 8 by a fine of not less than twenty nor more than fifty 9 dollars, upon indictment before any court of compe-10 tent jurisdiction.

SECT. 5. The act entitled, an act for the regulation

2 of bowling alleys, approved March 16, 1855, is hereby3 repealed.

SECT. 6. This act shall take effect from and after 2 its approval by the governor.
