REPORT.

LAND OFFICE, December 31, 1856.

To the Governor and Council of Maine : *

In compliance with law, I have the honor to submit the annual report of the operations of this office the present year.

During the current year there have been conveyed of the public lands, twenty-nine thousand one hundred and fifty-two acres—twenty-three thousand one hundred and twenty-one of which were conveyed under resolves of the Legislature. (See Schedules A, B and C.)

The timber and grass upon 23,594 acres of the reserved lots have been sold the current year for the sum of \$8,826.17. (See Schedule D.)

The lot reserved for the future disposition of the Legislature in plantation No. 14, Eastern Division, Washington county, was sold under a resolve of the last Legislature for \$155.

Under resolves of the Legislature there has been expended upon roads and bridges the sum of \$8,611.80, as follows:

The further sum of \$200 was paid for money expended by my immediate predecessor on the "Blanchard road," so called, agreeably to a resolve of the Legislature of 1855, the payment of which was withheld until a like sum should be raised and expended by the town of Blanchard, as contemplated in the resolve. Satisfactory evidence having been furnished that the same had been raised and expended by the town authorities, the amount was paid over by me to the agent having charge of the expenditure.

Five hundred dollars have been expended in the construction of a bridge in township No. 6, Range 5.

Two hundred dollars have also been expended in the erection of a bridge over the Little Madawaska stream in Letter I, Range 2.

One hundred dollars on bridge in Letter B, Range 1.

Two hundred dollars have also been expended on Mattawamkeag bridge.

The aforesaid sums I am satisfied have been as faithfully expended under the supervision of the several agents appointed for that purpose, as in previous years.

In pursuance of the "Resolve setting apart certain townships for settlement," passed by the Legislature of 1855:

Township Letter B, Range 1, has been surveyed and lotted by P. P. Burleigh, Esq.

Township Letter C, Range 1, partially surveyed the past year, and the unfinished surveys of townships letters F, Range 2, and G, Range 2, have also been finished by Noah Barker, Esq., the present year. Letter I, Range 2, has also been surveyed and lotted the present season under the direction of the same efficient surveyor.

The unfinished surveys of townships 4, Range 4, and 11, Range 1, have been completed the present season by Daniel Cummings, Esq.

The sale of lands to settlers the present year it will be seen are far from gratifying, and not at all commensurate with

the inducements held out by the State to our agricultural population, and a soil unequaled in fertility by the best tillage land of New England, and scarcely surpassed by those of the great west.

In addition to substantially *giving* its lands to settlers—*no money being required in payment for them*—the price being only *fifty cents* per acre in road labor at the usual rates—Maine also, to a large extent, builds their roads and bridges, while the best markets in the State for their abundant crops are to be found at all times at their own doors.

The amount received in cash at this office the present year, it will be perceived, amounts to the sum of \$148,087.90—the most of this has been derived from notes long due the State from the sales of its timber lands; \$31,198.07 of which was the accumulation of interest on the same.

Under the financial embarrassments and business disasters of a season of unwonted pecuniary severity, the debtors of the State have promptly and cheerfully met the required payments on their notes, thus giving assurance that the available securities which it now holds in this department, so largely reduced, will be speedily liquidated.

The lands owned by the State—nearly two millions of acres—have been very little reduced the present year by sales to settlers, already referred to.

Maine is still rich in its timber lands, and their constant and rapidly increasing growth should not only remove all apprehension of their future value and availability, but preserve them from hasty and improvident sales. Rich in commercial, manufacturing and mechanical interests—rivaling the wealthiest and oldest States in ship building—with unsurpassed advantages of ocean, harbors and rivers, and the increasing facilities of internal communication effected by steamboats and railroads—with a soil that yields abundantly to the hand of toil—Maine can well afford to reserve these great sources of wealth with their increasing value, for future wants and emergencies.
