# THIRTY-SIXTH LEGISLATURE 

## STATEOE MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND FIFTY-SEVEN.

AN ACT additional to Chapter 159 of the Public Laws passed A. D. 1845.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. 'That paragraph eight, section ten, of 2 the public laws, approved April fifth, 1845, is hereby 3 repealed.

Sect. 2. That section five of said act shall be 2 amended, by adding at the close of the paragraph 3 four-Also, all property held by any religious society, 4 as a ministerial fund, so that said paragraph as amended

[^0]5 shall read Fourth,-all houses of religious worship, 6 and the pews and furniture within the same, (except 7 for parochial purposes,) and all tombs and rights of 8 burial ; also, all property held by any religious society 9 as a ministerial fund.

Sect. 3. This act shall be in force on and after its 2 approval by the Governor.
