## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND FIFTY-SEVEN.

AN AC' $\Gamma$ additional to "An act further to protect personal liberty."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section l. When it shall come to the knowledge $\mathfrak{2}$ of any county attorney, that any person has been 3 arrested at any place within his county, and is claimed 4 as a fugitive slave under the provisions of any act of
5) congress, the said county attorney shall immediately 6 ruparr to the place where such person is held in 7 custody, and render him all. necessary and legal 8 assistance in making his defense against said claim.

Sect. 2. It shall be the duty of the said county 2 attorney to summon such witnesses as he shall deem 3 necessary to substantiate such defense, whose fees, 4 and all other necessary and legal expense incurred in 5 making such defense, shall be paid by the state.

Sect. 3. This act shall take effect from and after 2 its approval by the governor.
