STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVES relative to Bounty on Cod Fisheries.

Whereas, a bill has been proposed in congress to 2 repeal the act allowing bounties to vessels employed 3 in the cod fisheries, the passage of which will greatly 4 injure, if not destroy, one of the most important inter-5 ests of this state, and one which affords employment 6 to thousands of our hardy citizens; and

7 Whereas, the passage of such a bill will have the 8 effect to render almost, if not entirely useless, a large 9 class of vessels which, from their peculiar build and 10 model, cannot be successfully employed in other busi-11 ness, and which have been built, under what was 12 supposed to be a well-founded reliance upon the con-13 tinuance of a policy, which places us more nearly 14 upon a level with those of other nations engaged in

15 the same business, whose governments bestow a more16 liberal bounty thereon than our own; and

Whereas, our past history abundantly proves that the
18 cod fisheries afford the cheapest, best, and most efficient
19 school for manning our navy in time of war, there20 fore,

Resolved, That the repeal of the law granting boun-2 ties to vessels employed in the fishing business, will 3 be unjust and oppressive to those induced by the ex-4 istence of the law to embark a large amount of capi-5 tal therein; and at the same time will, in a national 6 point of view, be impolitic and unwise, inasmuch as 7 we shall thereby be deprived, in case of war, of the 8 most reliable source for a supply of American seamen.

Resolved, That our senators and representatives in 2 congress, be requested to exert their influence to pre-3 vent the repeal of the law allowing bounties to vessels 4 engaged in said business.

Resolved, That the governor be requested to trans-2 mit to our senators and representatives in congress a 3 copy of these resolutions to be laid before congress.
