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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND  
SIXTY.

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AN ACT amendatory of the twentieth section of chapter  
seventy-seven of the revised statutes.

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

The twentieth section of chapter seventy-seven of the  
2 revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto  
3 the following words: “ and in any case where the de-  
4 fendant was arrested on mesne process, and gave bond to  
5 disclose after judgment as provided in the one hundred  
6 and thirteenth chapter of the revised statutes, he shall  
7 have the same right and privilege to disclose after said  
8 next term and with the same effect as is therein pro-  
9 vided for disclosure after the term at which judgment

10 is rendered," so that the section as amended shall read  
11 as follows :

12 SECT. 20. The clerk of a county, by virtue of a  
13 certificate provided for in this chapter, stating the day  
14 of its reception, shall enter judgment as of the pre-  
15 ceding term, and execution may issue as of that term ;  
16 but all attachments then in force continue to be valid  
17 until thirty days after the next term in that county ;  
18 and in any case where the defendant was arrested on  
19 mesne process and gave bond to disclose after judg-  
20 ment as provided in the one hundred and thirteenth  
21 chapter of the revised statutes, he shall have the same  
22 right and privilege to disclose after said next term and  
23 with the same effect as is therein provided for dis-  
24 closure after the term at which judgment is rendered.
