### STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE authorizing the land agent to partition or sell the state's interest in certain lands.

WHEREAS, This state is a partner in interest and 2 owner in common with proprietors, holding lands un 3 divided with them in townships 18 R. 3, 18 R. 7, 4 17 R. 8, and 17 R. 10, W. E. L. S. Such ownership 5 being detrimental to the interests of the state in said 6 townships, therefore,

7 Resolved, That the land agent be authorized to cause 8 the state's interest in land in said townships to be 9 divided and set off by metes and bounds, so that such 10 interest belonging to said state may be held in sever-11 alty; or should it be deemed by said land agent for 12 the interest of the state, he is hereby authorized to 13 sell at public or private sale, all the state's interest

14 owned in common and undivided, in either or all of 15 said townships, first advertising such sale in the state 16 paper, and Aroostook Pioneer, and one paper published 17 in Bangor, not less than three months before the day 18 of sale; *provided*, that the rights of any settler there-19 on shall not be affected by such division or sale.
