## REPORT

OF THE

### JOINT SELECT COMMITTEE

ON

### TREASURER'S ACCOUNTS.

---

The Joint Select Committee on Treasurer's Accounts, which was "directed to examine said accounts and report thereon at the earliest practicable period," having attended to that duty ask leave to submit the following

#### REPORT.

The Report herewith accompanying, of William Caldwell, made to the Committee, shows the receipts and disbursements for the year ending Dec. 31, 1859, as shown by the books in the Treasurer's office.

The Committee have examined these accounts, item by item, and find them properly vouched and correctly cast.

The Committee also refer to the said Caldwell's report for the estimates of receipts and expenditures for the current year, and other information usually embodied in the Treasurer's annual report.

By this report there appears to be a cash balance on hand, Dec. 31, 1859, \$114,060 13

The Committee have ascertained that the late Treasurer has received since he first came into office and which is not charged to him on the books in the office, the further sum of 9,371 77

Total, \$123,431 90

He has exhibited vouchers for disbursements not entered on the books for the sum of 3,576 52

Balance, \$119,855 38

There should have been, Dec. 31, 1859, this amount of cash on hand. There was actually on hand the sum of \$25,782 34, showing an apparent deficit of 94,073 04.

Mr. Peck claims to be allowed also \$1,000 00 for an advance made to George M. Weston towards his services in prosecuting the "Mexican Claim" against the General Government. The "Claim" not having been paid, and the proper voucher not being presented, the Committee have not allowed this sum to Mr. Peck. When the "Claim" shall be paid and the proper vouchers produced, this sum should be allowed to Mr. Peck.

Of the sum received by him and not entered on the books, he received during the year 1857, \$543 51; during the year 1858, \$2,414 29; and the balance during 1859. This sum is made up of payments by towns of their State Tax, directly to the Treasurer.

Uniformly when Committees of the Legislature have examined the Treasurer's accounts, they have taken for the amount of State Tax paid in during the year, the amount shown on the books in the Treasurer's office. They have no other practicable means of ascertaining it. The only mode of accurately ascertaining it is by an examination of all the vouchers for payment of State taxes, held by the Treasurers and Collectors of every city, town and plantation in the State. This examination, of course, cannot be made by such a Committee. And without such an examination the Committees of 1858 and 1859 could not have ascertained that the Treasurer had received the sums above named, and not entered then upon the books.

Some method should be devised so that it could be known how much money is actually paid into the Treasury, whether credited on the books or not. Your Committee hope that, when they report upon the other matters committed to them, they shall be able to suggest some feasible method, and to report a bill, which shall remedy this defect.

Which sum was paid over to the present Treasurer, January 20, 1860, and was receipted for by him.

The above statement does not include a large amount of checks drawn by Mr. Peck, as Treasurer, and now apparently outstanding, but upon which the State is not in any way holden for payment. The amount and description of these checks will hereafter be given in detail.

The Committee have examined at great length the other matters committed to them. They have examined many witnesses, but in order to make a full, minute and thorough examination, they must examine many more, and some considerable time must elapse before they can make a final report.

The Land Agent has paid into the Treasury during the year 1859, the sum of nineteen thousand four hundred thirty-one dollars two cents, (\$19,431.02,) viz :—on general account, seventeen thousand six hundred forty-two dollars eighty-one cents, (\$17,642.81;) on permanent school fund, one thousand six hundred eighty-one dollars fifty-four cents, (\$1,681.54,) and on lands reserved for public uses, one hundred six dollars sixty-seven cents, (\$106.67.) The sums were received as follows :

The Treasurer of the State of Massachusetts, has paid to the Treasurer of this State, the sum of \$75,725.49, said sum being one-third of \$227,176.48 allowed by the United States on account of military services incurred by Massachusetts, prior to the partition of Maine into a separate State. In the act of partition, it was provided that one-third of the amount recovered from the United States should belong to Maine, and two-thirds to Massachusetts. The Governor, with advice of council, acting under a resolve of the Legislature, approved March 26, 1858, allowed our Commissioner at Washington, fifteen per cent. of the amount received on the Massachusetts claim, as compensation for his services in prosecuting said claim, and after deducting that sum, (\$11,358.82,) from the amount received of the Treasurer of Massachusetts, there is credited in this account, June 15, 1859, \$64,366.67.

Under an act of Congress, approved June 12, 1858, making appropriations for civil expenses, there was received from the Treasurer of the United States, on account of our North Eastern Boundary expenses, the sum of \$41,488.61; from which, after deducting per order of the Governor, with advice of council, twelve per cent., (\$4,978.63,) allowed our Commissioner, there is credited the balance, (\$36,509.98,) in this account, March 26, 1859.

There has also been received from the United States an additional sum of \$2,300.36, which will be found credited in this account, December 31, 1859.

As directed by resolve of the Legislature, approved February 5, 1859, the Treasurer paid to the Trustees of the Maine State Seminary, the sum of ten thousand dollars, and said Trustees, as required by statute, have deposited in the Treasurer's office, in trust for the said Trustees, the scrip of the State of Maine, for the sum of ten thousand dollars, which is placed to the credit of the Trustees in the books of this office.

\$51,000 of the public debt of this State will become due and payable, February 1, 1860.
