IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY.

AN ACT defining the form of recovery on coupon certificates.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

In all cases, in which bonds or certificates of debt, 2 with coupons for interest annexed, have been issued by 3 any corporation, or any county, city or town in this 4 state, and such coupons have been, or shall be assigned 5 or transferred, apart from the bonds or certificates to 6 which they were annexed, the holder of such coupons 7 for a valuable consideration, may maintain an action 8 of assumpsit, or prosecute any other appropriate rem-9 edy on the same, in his own name, against the maker, 10 for the recovery of the amount due thereon.
