### STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SHITY.

### AN ACT to incorporate the Damariscotta Water Power Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

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10 Thos. D. Boyd, David Genthner, Robert Kennedy, 11 Elbridge Norris, Thos. J. Merrill, Isaac Chapman, G. 12 W. Tukey, James Witham, J. G. Huston, Daniel Hitch-13 cock, with their associates, successors and assigns, are 14 hereby made and constituted a body politic and corpo-15 rate, by the name of the Damariscotta Water Power 16 Company, with all the powers and privileges, and sub-17 ject to all the duties and liabilities contained in the 18 laws of the state relating to manufacturing companies; 19 and said corporation is authorized to manufacture, upon 20 the Damariscotta river in the towns of Newcastle and 21 Damariscotta, in the county of Lincoln, woolen and 22 cotton goods, and any other articles the manufacture of 23 which is not contrary to the laws of this state; and for 24 this purpose, may purchase and hold real and personal 25 estate, not exceeding in value five hundred thousand 26 dollars, to be divided into shares of one hundred dollars 27 each, but no assessment shall be laid upon any shares in 28 said company of a greater amount in the whole, than one 29 hundred dollars; and may construct, erect and main-30 tain upon their own land and in the tide waters of the 31 Damariscotta river, at any point between Damariscotta 32 bridge and the Sisters, (so called,) suitable dams, piers, 33 locks, canals, flood-gates, ebb-gates, basins, building 34 and machinery as may be necessary for the purposes

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35 aforesaid; and the same may lease, sell or improve as 36 other owners of real or personal estate may lawfully do.

SECT. 2. Said corporation shall construct and main-2 tain suitable gate ways, or locks not exceeding thirty 3 feet in width, to enable vessels to pass down said river 4 as they have heretofore done without unnecessary 5 delay; but said corporation shall not be required to 6 open their gates or locks for the passage of vessels of 7 a less burthen than thirty tons measurement, only at 8 such times as they may be opened to fill the pond 9 above the dams; and the said corporation may close 10 the gates of said dams and locks, and retain the water 11 above the same to the point of the highest spring tides.

SECT. 3. The inhabitants of each of the towns of 2 Newcastle and Nobleborough, may be called upon at 3 any legal town meeting of said inhabitants, to vote 4 upon the following question, viz:—shall the Damaris-5 cotta Water Power Company be required to construct 6 fish ways in these dams? And if a majority of the 7 inhabitants so assembled, shall decide the question in 8 the negative, then no fish ways shall ever be required.

SECT. 4. Any three of the persons above named may 2 call the first meeting of the corporation, by posting a 3 notice of the time and place thereof, in some public 4 place in the towns of Newcastle and Damariscotta, or

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5 by publishing the same in some newspaper printed in 6 either of said towns, seven days at least before the 7 time of said meeting.

SECT. 5. This act shall take effect and be in force 2 when it is approved by the governor.
