STATE OF MAINE.

IN COUNCIL, January 7, 1862.

The Committee appointed to prepare a code of Rules to be observed by the Board for the current political year, having attended to the duty assigned them, recommend the following:

Which is respectfully submitted.

GEORGE A. FROST, CHAIRMAN.

Read and accepted by the Council, and by the Governor approved.

RULES.

1. At the time appointed for the meeting of the board, it shall be the duty of the members to be in their places.
2. When the board shall have been called to order by the governor, the journal of the preceding day shall be read by the secretary of state.
3. When members address the governor, they shall do so standing in their places.
4. The following standing committees shall be appointed, (viz.) on warrants; on accounts; on military and naval affairs and expenditures; on pardons and state prison affairs; on reform school; on Indian affairs; on the insane hospital; on the deaf, dumb and blind; on public buildings; and on pay roll.
5. All committees shall be appointed by the governor, and shall consist of three members, unless otherwise ordered.
6. No member shall act as counsel for any party before a committee of the legislature.
7. No member shall absent himself without leave, unless a quorum be left at the board.
8. In case the governor should be absent at the time appointed for the meeting of the board, the members shall be called to order by the senior councillor present, who shall act as chairman.
9. All communications to the two branches of the legislature shall be transmitted by the secretary of state.
10. No person, except the bearer of a message from the senate or the house of representatives, shall be admitted into the council chamber during the session of the council; nor at any other time, except by permission of the governor, one of the councillors, or the secretary of state.

11. Persons having business with the governor, any member of the council, or the secretary of state, shall be required to make their wishes known through the messenger.

12. Every member who shall present a petition, shall place his name thereon, and a brief statement of its contents.

13. The yeas and nays shall be called by the governor upon the nomination of all officers of important grade. Upon the nomination of state officers, the call to begin with the senior councillor; upon county nominations, with the councillor from said county, and then according to seniority.

14. Before the question is taken upon the confirmation of any nomination, any councillor having objections thereto, may state the same and the reasons therefor; which may be discussed by any member of the board; but no member shall speak more than twice upon the same nomination, without special leave.

15. No rule shall be dispensed with, except by the consent of two-thirds of the members present.

16. Such councillors as may approve the doings of the board in their absence, shall upon examination thereof, have the privilege of signing the record.



COUNCILLOR DISTRICTS.

The following arrangement was unanimously adopted January 3, 1862, by the members of the Forty-First Legislature in relation to the Councillor Districts for the coming ten years, viz :

First District—York and Oxford Counties.

Second District—Cumberland County.

Third District—Androscoggin, Franklin and Sagadahoc Counties.

Fourth District—Kennebec and Somerset Counties.

Fifth District—Lincoln, Knox and Waldo Counties.

Sixth District—Penobscot and Piscataquis Counties.

Seventh District—Hancock, Washington and Aroostook Counties.

Under this arrangement the respective Counties were declared to be entitled to a Councillor the following years :

York—1862, 1865, 1866, 1867, 1870, 1871.

Oxford—1863, 1864, 1868, 1869.

Cumberland—each year.
