RESOLVE relating to the National Administration and the conduct of the war.

Resolved, That, representing the People of Maine, we cordial-2 ly endorse the Administration of Abraham Lincoln in the con-3 duct of the war against the wicked and unnatural enemies of 4 the Republic; that we greet with unfeigned satisfaction the 5 evident design of the Administration to hold all interests and 6 institutions subordinate to the grand aim of preserving Consti-7 tutional liberty and the Union of these States; that the expres-8 sion of this purpose, as embodied in the confiscation bills 9 recently introduced into the Senate and House of Representa-10 tives by Mr. Trumbull, of Illinois, and Mr. Blair, of Missouri, 11 respectively, meets our unqualified approbation; that the 12 South-western expedition of General James H. Lane, under-13 taken at the special request of the President, and to be con-14 ducted on principles avowedly in harmony with those of the 15 Administration, promises, in our judgment, the happiest results 16 to the Union cause; that in these measures and movements 17 and all others calculated to crush this wicked rebellion, speedi-18 ly and finally, the Administration is entitled to and will receive 19 the unwavering support of the loyal people of Maine.
