STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVES relating to Government Economy.

Resolved, That it is the imperative duty of Congress
2 to provide for the abolition of all offices and places,
3 civil and military, which can be dispensed with with-
4 out detriment to the public service.

Resolved, That the salaries of all persons in the
2 employment of the government should be fixed at the
3 lowest point consistent with the efficiency of the
4 service.

Resolved, That the most rigid economy should be
2 introduced into every department of the government.

Resolved, That the people will cheerfully and promptly
2 pay such tax as will fully sustain the credit of the

3 government, and suffice for the vigorous prosecution of
4 the WAR.

Resolved, That a copy of these resolutions be for-
2 warded to the Senators and Representatives in Congress
3 from this State.
