STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
SIXTY-TWO.

AN ACT to repeal section six of chapter sixty-three of
the public laws of eighteen hundred and sixty-one, and
to provide that pauper disabilities shall not apply to
volunteers from this state.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECTION 1. The provisions of section six of chapter
2 sixty-three of the public laws of eighteen hundred
3 and sixty-one, are hereby repealed.

SECT. 2. No soldier who has or may hereafter enlist
2 in the service of his country from this state, or any of
3 the family of said soldier, shall be regarded as paupers
4 by reason of receiving aid from any town in said state
5 during said service.
