STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-FOUR.

AN ACT additional to an act entitled “an act for the suppression of drinking houses and tippling shops,” approved March twenty-fifth, A. D., eighteen hundred and fifty-eight.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECTION 1. The term “intoxicating liquors,”
2 wherever it occurs in the act to which this act is
3 additional, shall hereafter be held to embrace ale,
4 porter, strong beer, lager beer, and all other malt
5 liquors, as well as all distilled spirits, and wines,
6 without proof that the same are actually intoxicating.
7 This enumeration shall not be held to exclude from

8 the operation of said act any liquors or mixtures
9 which may be proved to be intoxicating.

SECT. 2, This act shall take effect on the first day
2 of April, A. D., eighteen hundred and sixty-four.
