STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-FOUR.

AN ACT to amend an act to provide bounties for soldiers, approved February twentieth, eighteen hundred and sixty-four.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. The first section of said act is hereby

- 2 amended by inserting after the word "who" in the
- 3 first line, the words "has enlisted or," also by adding
- 4 at the end of the first section the following words:
- 5 "And the basis of the quotas of the several towns on
- 6 any future call for troops, shall be fixed by deducting
- 7 from their respective enrolments the number of persons
- 8 enrolled, therein, who have enlisted on the quota of
- 9 other towns in this state, and aliens and non-residents

- 10 shall be credited to the town who may procure their
- 11 enlistments," so that the whole section as amended
- 12 shall read as follows:
- 13 There shall be paid from the treasury of the state to
- 14 each person who has enlisted or shall enlist and be
- 15 mustered into the service of the United States on the
- 16 quota of this state, a bounty of three hundred dollars,
- 17 subject to the following limitations.
- 18 First—This bounty shall not be paid for enlistments
- 19 from any town beyond the quota required of such town
- 20 to meet the call of February first, eighteen hundred
- 21 and sixty-four, unless that town shall have previously
- 22 filled the quota assigned to it under the call of Octo-
- 23 ber seventeenth, eighteen hundred and sixty-three;
- 24 and no person residing in this state, enlisting since
- 25 February second, eighteen hundred and sixty-four,
- 26 shall be credited to any city, town or plantation other
- 27 than that in which he has his residence, until the Oc-
- 28 tober and February quotas of his town are filled.
- 29 And any city, town or plantation having furnished its
- 30 proportion of men under the said calls of October and
- 31 February may continue to enlist men from any source
- 32 open to it under this limitation, who shall be credited
- 33 to it for its benefit under any call that may hereafter
- 34 be made.

35 Second—This act shall not apply to enlistments for 36 coast and frontier defence, unless persons enlisting in 37 that branch of the service shall be ordered for duty 38 beyond the limits of the state, in which case they shall 39 be paid two hundred dollars, in addition to the bounty 40 now established by law. And the basis of the quotas 41 of the several towns on any future call for troops shall 42 be fixed by deducting from their respective enrolments 43 the number of persons enrolled therein who have en-44 listed on the quota of other towns in this state, and 45 aliens and non-residents shall be credited to the town 46 who may procure their enlistments.
