STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-FOUR.

AN ACT requiring additional duties and providing for an increase of the salaries of the justices of the supreme judicial court.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECTION 1. At some time during the law term of the
2 supreme judicial court in the middle district of each
3 year, a meeting of all the justices thereof shall be held
4 at Augusta, in the county of Kennebec, and at such
5 meeting they shall determine all questions of law and
6 equity previously presented by the parties to said
7 court sitting as a court of law and considered by the
8 same wherein a decision shall not have been made.

SECT. 2. The salary of each justice of said court shall be the sum of two thousand and five hundred dollars, to be paid quarterly from the treasury of the state, on the first day of January, April, July and October in each year, instead of the sum now provided by law, the first payment under this act to be on the first day of July in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and sixty-four.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after the last day of March in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and sixty-four.
