STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-FOUR.

AN ACT in addition to section seven of chapter one hundred and thirty-five of the revised statutes in reference to proceedings in capital cases.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. Whenever any person is sentenced to
- 2 death by the supreme judicial court it shall be the duty
- 3 of the clerk thereof to certify forthwith to the governor
- 4 and council under the seal of said court the whole rec-
- 5 ord of the proceedings in such case.
 - SECT. 2. The governor, with the advice and consent
- 2 of the council, may stay the issue of the warrant men-
- 3 tioned in said section seven, and determine whether
- 4 the convict shall continue in solitary confinement after

- 5 the expiration of one year from the day of sentence,
- 6 or shall, till otherwise ordered by the governor and
- 7 council be employed like other prisoners.
