REPORT.

To the Legislature of Maine:

In compliance with 5th section of chapter 25 of public acts, approved March 13th, 1861, I submit the following Report:

The means available for the increase of the Library during the year ending December 31, 1865, were, the balance from the previous year of three hundred thirty dollars and fifteen cents (\$330.15), the annual appropriation of five hundred dollars (\$500), and the sum of five dollars (\$5) for duplicates sold by the Trustees, making a total amount of eight hundred thirty-five dollars and fifteen cents (\$835.15).

The expenditure for the purchase of books for the Library, for the same period, has been eight hundred fifty-seven dollars and sixteen cents (\$857.16).

Of this amount, the sum of three hundred eighty-eight dollars and nineteen cents was expended for the purchase of missing volumes of Blackwood's Magazine, the Westminster Review, Bibliotheca Sacra and Theological Review, The American Journal of Science and Arts, The Democratic Review, and American Eclectic Review, under a resolve of March 24, 1864.

The whole number of volumes and pamphlets added during the year, is six hundred and forty-six.

It will be seen that the purchase of volumes required to make sets in this department complete, absorbed nearly one-half of the appropriation, leaving about four hundred forty-six dollars for the increase of the general library, a sum entirely inadequate to its wants and character.

It has been suggested that it would be better to complete the sets of standard works in each branch of literature or science in order, without attempting, as is the present policy, a gradual and uniform, although comparatively imperfect, supply of all. It is doubted whether the proposed plan would be acceptable, as those devoted to the investigation of a specific branch might deem its immediate and full supply to be more important than that of any other, and might consider any additions injudicious in which they did not equally participate.

This suggestion, however, has been followed as far as practicable in the law department, because of the almost unanimous expression in favor of its enlargement to meet the necessities of the Legislature.

The miscellaneous works have been chosen with a view to meet the various tastes and pursuits of those who have the use of the library, and to secure the most recent and meritorious publications in each department of literature, science and the arts.

Inter-State exchanges during the year have been confined entirely to the loyal States, nothing having been received from the insurgent States since their attempted withdrawal from the Union.

The Provincial Parliament of Canada is liberal and constant in its interchange of public documents.

By a recent change in the postage law, the expense of exchanges between the several States, and between them and the United States, has been increased. State documents could be sent by the governor of any one State to the governor of any other State, under frank, and were thus furnished to State Libraries without any cost. They are now transported only by express at a large expense. It is believed that they could be transported by mail at a less cost, and an effort will be made to effect such an arrangement.

In the last Annual Report, the attention of the Legislature was called to the exposure of the books in the library. There is some annoyance and inconvenience from their being disarranged and misplaced, as all classes of persons, without distinction, have free access to them, and may examine them at pleasure. It is quite impracticable to preserve a uniform and orderly appearance of the books upon the shelves, if inexperienced and careless hands, in constant succession, are allowed to disturb them and remove them from their proper places. It may be found necessary, therefore, in order to provide security against the constant disarrangement, and occasional loss of books, to close the alcoves with glass

doors. Such a protection has been found to be expedient in many libraries.

Four volumes are missing from the library.

Many of the books purchased are bound in too light and fragile a form for the State Library, and it will be a prominent aim to procure volumes in a more substantial binding.

The work of preparing an index of the public documents of the State, under the law of February 24, 1865, has been commenced, and it will be continued as opportunity allows until completed.

Hon. James G. Blaine, Hon. N. A. Farwell and Hon. Lot M. Morrill have supplied the library with the current Congressional publications, so important for present and future reference.

I subjoin a list of all books, maps and charts acquired during the year, by purchase, donation and exchange.
