IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-SIX.

AN ACT to amend section three of chapter thirty-nine of the revised statutes relating to lime and lime casks.

---

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECTION 1. Section three of chapter thirty-nine of 2 the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out 3 the word “*ten*” in the fifth line and inserting in its 4 stead the word “*eight*,” and by striking out the words 5 “*not more than four of which shall be alderwood*,” in 6 the fifth and sixth lines, and inserting in their stead 7 the words “*all of which hoops shall be of oak, ash,* 8 *beech, birch, maple, cherry or elm wood*,” so that the 9 section as amended shall read as follows :—“ No lime 10 manufactured in this state shall be sold, exposed to

11 sale, or shipped on board any vessel in casks but such  
12 as is well burnt and pure ; contained in casks made of  
13 sound and seasoned staves and heading well fixed on  
14 the inside, with at least eight good and strong hoops,  
15 on the same, all of which hoops shall be of oak, ash,  
16 beech, birch, maple, cherry, or elm wood, well driven  
17 and secured with nails, and duly inspected''; and the  
18 residue of the section as in the published statutes.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved  
2 by the governor.
